


Don't let this opportunity get away the 1599 Foxon Road Dilemma

Dear Editor:

There has been a lot of talk as of late regarding what to do with 1599 Foxon Road (Rte. 80), originally the home of North Branford's Center School, playground, and the Edward Wall Baseball Field. I attended Kindergarten there about 65 years ago and played Little League on this site as well. The dilemma: what do we do now with 1599 Foxon Road? There has been discussion for commercial development, moving the police department to the site, and even an ambulance dispatch center.

North Branford is a beautiful New England town but it is losing its identity. It is one of the few Connecticut towns that does not have a town green or gathering place aside from the POCO festival grounds. 1599 is the last property on the Route 80 side of town that provides the possibility of establishing a green. It could become a place where people can gather to relax, enjoy an evening concert, have a craft fair, or an occasional farmers market where local farmers, brewers, winemakers, or merchants can introduce their products and tempt people to visit their establishments. Some EV charging stations could be on site. A gazebo for a music or theater venue could be built. There is a basketball court already there which could be brought back to life. The remnants of an historic trolley line, The Shoreline Electric Railway, run through the back of the property. It could evolve into a "Rails to Trails" pedestrian/bicycle way. This would connect the existing trail systems from Guilford and North Branford through the newly proposed 300 unit Notch Hill Village, to 1599 Foxon Road. A pedestrian crossing into Central Plaza can be established giving easy access to Central Plaza could only help to enhance economic development. 1599 Foxon Road would also serve as a trailhead with parking, giving access to miles of established and future walking /bike trails.

Our future depends on attracting young people to our community. Surveys found in various publications that highlight the best places to live in the USA use (1) open space and (2) accessibility to outdoor activities/recreation as two important criteria when they evaluate communities' livability. Young families are attracted to places that have open space and recreation which include running, hiking, and biking. It's time to incorporate progressive ideas in all future development projects. There is ample money available for open space development. Building pedestrian bridges over streams, improving pathways, and enhancing the green space as mentioned above can be entirely funded by available grants and donations. It would not cost the town anything and would make some beautiful land that is totally inaccessible today available to be enjoyed by all in the future.

Stopping a tax before it starts: true tax relief

A mid-November news report indicated that Connecticut gas prices averaged \$3.54 per gallon, a \$1.41 increase from a year earlier. Many speculate the price will continue to climb, placing more pressure on residents and businesses already stressed by cost increases from every angle.

With that in mind, and with an election year looming, it was no surprise to see Gov. Lamont announce that he wouldn't pursue the controversial Transportation Climate Initiative (TCI) during the legislative session that begins in February. TCI is a regional "cap and invest" program that aims to reduce carbon emissions by having fuel suppliers (they're deemed polluters) pay money into the initiative to fund a wide variety of projects. I'm among those who contend that TCI is a gas tax—after all, suppliers will pass their cost increases on to motorists.

The governor sounded magnanimous in news reports resulting from his Nov. 16 announcement, saying residents couldn't afford the financial squeeze right now.

At the same time, though, and as he even talks about providing tax relief, the governor is unwilling to bend on a signature policy that will increase your cost of living here.

The legislature in June adopted his highway tax targeting commercial trucks, ignoring objections from trucking and grocery industry advocates who said it would lead to higher prices for consumers.

Passed along party lines, the truck tax goes into effect in 2023 and is expected to generate \$45 million in revenue that year and \$90 million annually in subsequent years.

As the governor opined on TCI and again promised tax relief, I urged him to scrap the truck tax. What better way to provide relief from inflation and other financial challenges than by eliminating a tax before it even begins? After all, the state is receiving more than \$5 billion in federal infrastructure aid. We have a \$3 billion budget surplus that's expected to grow, too.

In Massachusetts, which has backed away from TCI, officials recognize they have enough money to achieve their infrastructure, public transportation and emissions reduction goals.

Here in Connecticut, with so much federal aid, we have a real chance to remake our transportation grid—from roads and bridges, to funding mechanisms and project prioritization.

The governor, however, prefers the well-worn path. Aside from rejecting my call to eliminate the truck tax, he reaffirmed his commitment to TCI within 24 hours of sidelining it.

If the legislature puts the gas tax bill on his desk, he'll sign it. So much for relief.

In addition, eating slowly allows the senses the full experience of all the wonderful flavors and aromas. And, the brain will signal the stomach that it's satisfied which will prevent overeating. NEW TRAIL SYSTEM IN DEVELOPMENT THROUGH COLLABORATION BETWEEN NORTH BRANFORD LAND CONSERVATION TRUST, HONEYWELL, NORTHFORD ICE PAVILION, THE PINES OF NORTHFORD AND BELFONTI COMPANIES

New Trails to Open in North Branford in Spring 2022

The North Branford Land Conservation Trust (NBLCT) (<u>www.</u> <u>nblandtrust.org</u>) announced today the development of a system of public walking trails in North Branford, Conn., made possible through a collaboration with Honeywell, the Northford Ice Pavilion (<u>www.northfordice.com</u>), the Pines of North Branford and Belfonti Companies (<u>www.belfonti.com</u>).

Honeywell contributed \$15,000 to help fund the project and will offer parking accommodations at its site for residents of North Branford who want to walk the trails. Honeywell employees will also volunteer their time, working alongside volunteers from the North Branford Land Conservation Trust, in the creation of the trails and building foot-bridges and wooden walkways where needed.

"We are proud to give back to our North Branford community," said Steven Seehusen, North Branford plant director, Honeywell. "These new passive recreation opportunities help improve the walkability of our community and preservation of greenspace, making North Branford an even more vibrant area."

The new trail system will be created on a 27-acre parcel of land owned by NBLCT. The site is mostly forested and includes a diversity of native trees, shrubs, flowering plants, and wildlife. The proposed trail is on level ground, with one small stream and several wooded wetlands adding to the diversity.

According to David Sargent, NBLCT president, "The proposed trail system is still in the design phase, but will contain at least a loop trail, taking advantage of the interesting features of the parcel, and two short entry spurs. "The first spur would be a trailhead with a kiosk on the eastern side of the Northford Ice Pavilion and the second will be a at the existing entrance off Village Street."

"Our plan is to build wooden trail walkways on site to protect sensitive wet soils and to allow users to cross the wetlands area and view the 'inside' of a forested wetland", said Bonnie Symansky, director of the NBLCT.

The NBLCT land abuts two other parcels of land owned by related entities of Belfonti Companies, one of which is home to the Northford Ice Pavilion and the other of which is home to The Pines, a 120-unit luxury apartment community which is currently going through the approvals process. The Belfonti Companies will contribute to the project by donating the cost to create a trail from Fire Lite Drive to the trailhead entry kiosk on the Northford Ice Pavilion's land. Belfonti will also grant an easement of its land, at no cost to NBLCT, that will allow for the creation of the proposed trailhead entry point and extend the trail system from the land owned by NBLCT to the parking area at Honeywell, thereby permitting for additional public access to the trail system. According to Michael Belfonti, CEO of Belfonti Companies, the Northford Ice Pavilion is also willing to provide parking accommodations near the trail's entry point for use by those seeking to walk the trails.

Mr. Belfonti said, "The trail project as envisioned could not have moved forward without the generous contribution from Honeywell and the positive synergy between all participating organizations. Through our combined efforts we are all helping to create a vibrant mixed-use area in North Branford with multiple components including housing, employment, and active and passive recreation all within walking distance."

"Parents and guests of our hockey players and ice skaters are going to be thrilled to know that they will now have the added amenity of walking trails right next to our facility," said Marty Roos, one of the owners of the Northford Ice Pavilion.

North Branford Fall Leaf Collection The last curbside pickup of leaves will be during the week of December 6-10.

Leaves will only be taken if in untapped biodegradable paper bags.

"Please Don't Feed the Storm Drain"

Holiday Recycling

Did you know that the plastic shipping envelopes that you receive in the mail are considered plastic film? These are the ones that are plastic on the inside and outside. The ones with paper on the outside need to go into the trash because they are mixed materials.

Please remember to put your cardboard into the recycle bin but the Styrofoam goes into the trash. Styrofoam does have a recycle symbol on it but we don't have the equipment to recycle Styrofoam yet.

Plastic Film Recycling Plastic bags cannot go into your recycling bin.

To recycle them, please drop off clean and dry bags at our town's collection bins or any grocery store. All of our collection sites have received free Trex benches because of the amount of plastic film they have collected. The following locations are collecting plastic film for our town: Country Paint and Hardware, T.J's Launderette, Town Hall, Atwater and Smith Libraries, STW Community Center, Northford Store and The Food Pantry of North Branford.

While not a collection site, Guilford Fence is recycling their plastic wrap with the town to help with our recycling efforts.

Please remember to empty your plastic bags of food and liquids before placing them in the collection bin. It may just be water to you, but mixed with other things it becomes a sticky mess. The bags are hand sorted by your neighbors.

Plastic film includes: grocery bags, newspaper sleeves, wood pellet bags, salt bags, and zipper bags for recycling. They also accept plastic wraps from water bottle cases, diapers, bathroom tissue, and paper towels, as well as bubble wrap and shipping pillows.

Plastic bags with recycling symbols #2 or #4 ARE accepted. Plastic bags with recycling symbols #5 or #7 (i.e. salad and grape bags), crinkly snack bags (potato chips, popcorn, and candy wrappers), pet food bags, frozen
