NB Plastic Film Recycling
Program – Year Six Update
Year six of the Plastic Film Recycling Program in North Branford, con-

Year six of the Plastic Film Recycling Program in North Branford, continued to show enthusiastic support by North Branford residents. 4,700 pounds of plastic film was collected in 2022, which is the highest yearly total to date. Thank you.

Some milestones were met by our collection locations, since we started in 2017. Country Paint and Hardware eclipsed the 6,000 pound mark, Northford Store 4,000, Atwater and Smith Libraries, and Guilford Fence 3,000 pounds. The STW Community Center and TJ's Launderette both crossed the 2,000 pound mark. Lastly, Town Hall made it to 1,000. Very impressive for our Town.

As part of the program, we earn benches from the Trex Company, which are then distributed to the collection locations.

Now that all locations have earned a bench, we asked if the collection locations would be willing to donated the next bench they earn to an organization in Town and they were very willing to do so.

So, the bench the Town earned for the first half of 2023, from Country Paint and Hardware, will be going to NBFD Company 4. Subsequent benches will go to the other 3 Fire Companies and then to the Police Department.

Please be sure to thank the collection locations for their gracious gesture in donating the benches to those that help keep us safe in NB.

On a final note, which will greatly assist with the sorting of the plastic film, please only place acceptable items in the collection bins and remember to TURN ALL BAGS INSIDE OUT.







Will Driveway Attack Be a Watershed Moment? Don't Count on It



I received a "have you seen this" text message from a friend recently that contained a link to a video depicting the type of crime we've read a lot about over the last couple of years. It was a middle-aged man fighting off four masked juveniles attempting to steal a car out of his driveway in Rocky Hill.

The broad daylight attack was shocking if not infuriating.

Question is, will this latest brazen act be enough to motivate Democrats who control our statehouse to admit that their "smart on crime" approach to public safety has gone off course?

Residents want, and deserve, something different.

As one commenter wrote on a WFSB 3 social media post, "I hope there is a deeper, bigger purpose for the showing/sharing of this video. Maybe it should be sent to Governor Ned Lamont so he can read all of the concerns and maybe start to formulate some action."

I'm not so sure that will happen.

Earlier this month, two tragedies garnered headlines statewide yet elicited little in the way of a policy-focused response from my majority party colleagues. On the same day, a 17-year-old drowned in Waterbury after fleeing police who were responding to a stolen car case, and in New York state, investigators there say a 49-year-old military veteran was killed in a crash involving a vehicle driven by a 14-year-old after it was stolen from a northwest Connecticut community.

The two cases, police say, could be linked.

As you likely know, those cases came on the heels of a crime closer to our home—five teens in a stolen car hit several police cars in East Haven in late March

As it was following the driveway crime in Rocky Hill last week, the refrain from the Governor's office and legislative Democrats is that Connecticut is among the safest states in the nation. Their "smart on crime" policies, they contend, are effective.

Tell that to the elderly woman who was victimized in an afternoon carjacking outside of her apartment building in Wethersfield last month.

This session, Republicans offered a package of public-safety proposals that included expanding the circumstances under which juveniles charged with certain violent crimes are automatically transferred to the adult criminal docket and adding another two years to the mandatory minimum sentence for carjacking when a firearm or deadly weapon is involved.

Unfortunately, our proposals aimed at installing more accountability into Connecticut's criminal justice system have been received coolly by our majority party colleagues.

Last month, Waterbury's mayor, a prominent figure in Democrat party politics, expressed his frustration with the Democrat-controlled General Assembly, telling a packed house of community leaders during his state of the city address that criminals have more rights than everyone in the room.

Though experience tells me otherwise, I'm hopeful that with a little more than a month left in the legislative session my colleagues will feel compelled to act.

Right now, as I write this column, another notification came through on my phone—an announcement from police in Meriden, who say they've arrested three juveniles who crashed into another vehicle before slamming into a house.

If the legislature doesn't take a stand now, sending a message to obviously emboldened criminals, I fear we'll see more and more of these types of crimes this summer.

Be ready to get on the water this summer by taking this 8-hour class that starts Monday, May 1st from 6:30 PM – 8:30 PM for 4 weeks at Indian Neck Yacht Club, 87 Harding Ave., Branford. In addition to basic boating, the course will also include personal watercraft operation. Successful completion of this course, and the proctored exam given during the class, will satisfy Connecticut's state licensing requirements. The cost of this course is \$40. The U.S. Coast Guard website for boating safety courses lists the Power Squadron's ABC class as "the most comprehensive boating safety course available".

All students must go to the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection website and Online Sportsmen Licensing to obtain their free Connecticut Conservation ID number in advance of the class. Go to www.ct.gov/ deep/sportsmenlicensing to obtain the number unless you already have a number from a fishing or hunting license.

All students must complete registration and pay New Haven Sail and Power Squadron \$40 per person prior to April 24. Prospective students should contact Peter DePascale at (203) 671-2420 or <u>bathworksinc@gmail.com</u>.


T-Bird Baseball starts off 4-2




