"Great Disappointment" **Dear Editor**

We attended the North Branford Town Council meeting that was held on May 3, 2022. Residents had the opportunity to provide comments regarding the cellular tower application for 222 Clintonville Road. As residents on Pistapaug Road, we witnessed one of our neighbors address the Council. Before her remarks, she asked if the Town Manager had shared the video (that she had taken the time to record) with the Council mem-

bers. He responded that "he did not". As we sat there, we could not understand why and neither did he provide a reason (or apology). My neighbor went on to describe how inappropriate it is to place a cell tower in a residential historical neighborhood as the cell tower would be highly visible from her property. In review.

We then heard about close proximity to the Pistapaug Road and Old Post Road neighborhoods. As residents of the town, we were so enraged by the comments repeatedly made. These included, "we really feel for you", "so sorry this is happening to you but it has to happen to someone", and "you are the sacrificial lamb". The insensitivity of these comments was immense.



State Representative Vincent Candelora Tax relief that isn't relief enough



If you've spent any time on social media recently, chances are you've seen the Governor or his surrogates in the legislature talking as if they're pulling residents from the morass of unaffordability that's synonymous with the name Connecticut.

In describing the budget bill they passed at the end of the 2022 legislative session, Governor Lamont and Democrats in the General Assembly

are quick to say they've provided Connecticut residents with "the largest tax cut in state history!"

What they aren't saying, though, is that their \$600 million in tax "cuts" are a drop in the bucket when compared to the more than \$6 billion in tax revenue associated with a decade of budgets from the Democratically-controlled capitol.

One must look back only to 2019, when the Governor and his statehouse majority approved a two-year budget that carried nearly \$1.8 billion in tax hikes. Consequently, you're paying more today for digital downloads, dry cleaning, prepared meals and a laundry list of other goods and services.

I didn't support the latest budget plan, signed into law May 9. Aside from the 6.4 percent spending hike, it just doesn't provide enough tax relief when considering Connecticut's \$4 billion budget surplus. Yes, you've been overtaxed.

I joined my Republican colleagues in offering an alternative plan that would have provided \$1.2 billion in tax relief—double what became law. Aside from addressing major shortcomings in the Democrat plan, such as relief from skyrocketing diesel prices, we offered an income tax cut—the first in the state since 1995. It would have lowered the rate from 5 percent to 4 percent for individuals earning less than \$75,000 and joint filers earning less than \$175,000 annually.

That type of tax-cutting concept, though not all-encompassing, is critical. Aside from providing roughly \$750 in annual relief to some families, it would be a step toward installing the structural tax reform our state desperately needs.

Residents and employers need us to finally demonstrate that type of commitment.

Instead, Democrats adopted their \$600 million relief plan—roughly half of which is temporary. Their \$250 child tax credit (rebate) expires after a year. Their ballyhooed car tax cap impacts only half of Connecticut's municipalities, and early cracks in the plan's formula—the state pays towns for the revenue they'll lose by lowering/freezing their tax rate—have the scheme on shaky ground already.

Given the historic influx of federal aid combined with the unprecedented boon in tax revenue, I consider the recent budget plan a missed opportunity.

hood of one of the Town Council members, would they be

willing to be the "sacrificial lamb"? I doubt that very much. In fact, as we understand, another tower site had been investigated behind Stanley T Williams that would have been in close proximity to the home of one of the Town Council members. Was the same comment that "someone has to be the sacrificial lamb" made at that time? Obviously, not. We do not need pity from our representatives! Rather, we need due diligence in representing **ALL**, not just those that might be members of the Council.

One of the Council members condescendingly explained that many sites in town had been evaluated. We do not profess to know all of the mechanics and operations of cellular technology. With that said, as educated professionals, you cannot expect us to believe that 222 Clintonville Avenue is the only site that will enable the necessary telecommunications for our town's fire and police departments. That just is not logical. It is not honest. Frankly, it is insulting.

Representative Candelora, a long-time servant within our community, recommended a different location on the town's 24-acre site located on 1332 Middletown Ave and provided his recommendation to the State Siting Council in a letter dated April 8, 2022. We find it very hard to believe that he would do so without an accurate understanding of the town's needs and capabilities of the site that he proposed.

We are so very disappointed in our town. To support a proposed cellular tower in a residential and historic neighborhood when there are other options and to completely disregard some constituents is shameful. In fact, during the meeting Town Council members showed more interest in the prolonged conversation and joking about the disc golf than the genuine concerns of town residents who they are elected to represent.

Safety Tips for Outdoor Grilling:

- Gas and charcoal BBQ grills must only be used outdoors. If used indoors, or in any enclosed spaces, such as tents, they pose both a fire hazard and the risk of exposing occupants to toxic gases and potential asphyxiation.
- Position the grill well away from siding, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Place the grill a safe distance from lawn games, play areas and foot traffic.
- Keep children and pets away from the grill area: declare a three-foot "safe zone" around the grill.
- Put out several long-handled grilling tools to give the chef plenty of clearance from heat and flames when flipping burgers.
- Periodically remove grease or fat buildup in trays below grill so it cannot be ignited by a hot grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended when in use.

Charcoal Grills

- Purchase the proper starter fluid and store the can out of reach of children, and away from heat sources.
- Never add charcoal starter fluid when coals or kindling have already been ignited, and never use any flammable or combustible liquid other than charcoal starter fluid to get the fire going.

Gas Grills

- Check the gas cylinder hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. A light soap and water solution applied to the hose will quickly reveal escaping propane by releasing bubbles. If you determine your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame:
- Turn off the gas tank and grill.
- If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again.
- If the leak does not stop, **call the fire department.**
- If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not attempt to move the grill.
- Use only equipment bearing the mark of an independent testing laboratory. Follow the manufacturers' instructions on how to set up the grill and maintain it.
- Never store propane gas cylinders in buildings or garages. If you store a gas grill inside during the winter, disconnect the cylinder and leave it outside.




Please help us help you. Sometimes it can be difficult to find the proper address when responding to an emergency. Please have proper house numbers that can be viewed from both directions on the street.






