State Representative Vincent Candelora



If you picked up a newspaper or watched the evening news any time over the last couple of weeks, you might've seen something about a state program called Baby Bonds, which by and large has been heralded by the news media.

The long-term goal of the program, proponents say, is to close the wealth gap between wealthy and poor residents. Here's how it works: Starting July 1, any child whose birth

is covered by HUSKY (our state's label for Medicaid) will automatically receive a \$3,200 bond that can only be accessed between the ages of 18 and 30. It's estimated the value of a bond, depending on interest rates and when it's claimed, could grow upward of \$20,000. The recipient must be a resident to cash out his or her Baby Bond, and it's expected the money would be used for school, home purchase, or business start-up.

The program was created in 2021 but didn't take flight for a key reason: Gov. Lamont, understandably, balked at the idea of borrowing money to pay for it. It's been a sore spot for Democrats since then, with several making its launch a top priority as they campaigned for office last fall. Recently, Baby Bonds advocates flexed their muscle to reignite the conversation, using their potential support for the state budget as leverage with the Governor, who has joined Republicans in calling for a budget featuring middle class tax relief.

The strategy worked, and it wasn't long before the Governor—on May 16—stood alongside legislative Democrats to announce they had found a way to pay for the program. Their plan hasn't quite received the scrutiny in the news media that I think it deserves.

Here's how they're getting the program off the ground: The Governor in 2019 controversially restructured teacher pension debt to create budget flexibility, saving money in the short term but growing future debt for the next generation. The plan required the state to create a reserve makeweight—using \$392 million in surplus taxpayer funds—to satisfy Connecticut bond holders. Now, citing state surpluses and recent payments toward unfunded pension liabilities, Democrats say that reserve fund is no longer necessary and are taking \$380 million of it for the Baby Bonds program while using \$12 million to buy a special insurance policy to satisfy ratings agencies.

True to form, there was no conversation about whether there were other uses for that "found money"—say, returning it to taxpayers who could benefit from any bit of relief the state could send their way. Or, to keep the vein of improving outcomes for children, perhaps investing that money in K-12 schools, early childhood programs, or healthcare. The latter path, after all, was floated by the Governor when he blocked Baby Bonds.

Philosophical debate about using taxpayer dollars for Baby Bonds aside,



I have an issue with the shell game nature of the fast-pitch "solution" that's being used to launch the program, which, to me, stands at odds with the message of fiscal responsibility the Governor often touts.



Summer Wellness Series Part 1 of 3 -The Power of Hydration - and the Rise of Electrolyte Supplements



Summer is almost here - although day to day it's hard to determine what season we're in, let's go with what the calendar tells us. Based on what we're accustomed to, a New England summer tends to be extremely hot in August. That's when advice on increasing fluid intake to "beat the heat" is most available. Our Summer Wellness Series addresses this topic first, not only to set the groundwork for extreme temperatures, but to focus on the lesser known year round benefits. Over the next 3 months, we will feature a different topic. Each significant on its own, yet very much connected to the others, in order to help you win with your health the whole year through. To start, let's check out the world

of hydration and electrolytes.

Water, the "elixir of life," holds incredible benefits for the body beyond just exercise. The advantages are for everyone regardless of whether or not you hit the gym regularly. Hydration isn't just for health and fitness enthusiasts, it's essential for everyone's well-being. Proper hydration keeps the body cool, aids in proper digestion, boosts brain function, supports healthy skin, and even aids in weight management. Water is involved in joint lubrication and nutrient transportation. Just like a well watered garden flourishes, the body thrives when properly hydrated.

To ensure we're maximizing water intake, there are several strategies we can follow.

- 1. Consume water frequently throughout the day rather than large amounts in a short period
- 2. Add some lemon or other fruit to add flavor which can lead to better intake
- 3. Be mindful of water quality. While tap water is generally safe for drinking, it may contain impurities that affect taste and potentially hinder absorption. Using a water filter or opting for bottled water can help. *Tip: rather than a case of smaller bottles, buy gallons to fill your own water bottle*
- 4. Consume fruits and vegetables high in water content like watermelon, cucumber, cantaloupe and zuchini.
- 5. Note that cold water tends to be absorbed more quickly, while warmer water might be more comfortable to drink. However, finding a balance that suits preference and facilitates consumption is key.
- 6. Avoid excessive amounts of caffeine and alcohol that can act as diuretics. Similarly, certain medications or medical conditions may impact water absorption and retention

7. Know that there may be times when drinking water alone is not enough In recent years, electrolyte supplements have surged in popularity, promising to replenish vital minerals and enhance hydration. Their rising popularity reflects the growing awareness of the importance of electrolyte balance. These supplements come in various forms, such as powders, tablets, and liquid drops, making them convenient for different lifestyles. But what sets them apart, and should we consider incorporating them into our hydration routine?

Electrolytes are minerals like sodium, potassium, calcium, and magnesium, which play crucial roles in our body's fluid balance and nerve function. Electrolyte supplements, when used correctly, can help replenish these essential minerals and enhance hydration, especially during periods of intense activity, hot weather, or illness. My husband, who is a baseball umpire, learned the hard way to always add electrolyte supplements to his water bottle. Doing games in intense heat, sometimes two in a row while in full uniform, he always had plenty of water with him but electrolytes are lost through sweat and when loss is severe, can bring about unpleasant symptoms that water alone won't help. Electrolytes are like the body's own personal hydrating system, keeping us in balance and performing at our best.

As with anything else, not all electrolyte supplements are created equal so it's



Council Creates Blueprint Committee to Formulate Comprehensive Plan on Town Land and Facilities

Town Residents Sought for Membership

NORTH BRANFORD – At their regular meeting on May 16th, the North Branford Town Council voted unanimously in favor of a resolution establishing a Town Blueprint Committee. The purpose of the committee is to evaluate previous town land use studies, develop a scope for the future land use study requested by the Town Council, and to recommend a plan for the comprehensive use of all town properties to the Town Council. The Council is hoping that interested members of the public might step up to participate in the committee.

Members of this new committee will be appointed by the Town Council and will include two members from the Council, one member from the Planning and Zoning Commission, one member from the Parks and Recreation Commission, one member of the Economic Development Commission, and two electors from the town; one each from Northford and North Branford. The Mayor, Town Manager, and Director of Public Works will serve as ex officio members.

The committee has an opening for one public member on each side of town, and we are hoping to see interested residents express a desire to serve on it."

Macmillen said that those interested should submit a letter indicating their interest in serving, and an optional resume, to the Town Manager's office for consideration by the Council. Submissions should be digital to gcox@northbranfordct. gov. Questions should be directed to 203-484-6000.

The Council expects to make its appointments soon, as the committee is charged with reporting out its findings to the Town Council no later than March 31st of 2024.




