Local Entrepreneur, Andy Bozzuto, to Chair Totoket Historical Society Fundraising Campaign to Restore Northford Schoolhouse



The Totoket Historical Society is excited to announce the launch of a new fundraising campaign spearheaded by Andy Bozzuto, local entrepreneur, to restore The Little Red School House located on Old Post Rd. in Northford, CT. Bozzuto is no stranger to historic preservation after the successful launch of Millpond Gatherings, one of the state's most notable restaurant and venue spaces located on the historic site of the old Maltby-Stevens Factory on

Middletown Ave. in Northford. "They asked me and there was no hesitation; I have a deep interest in preserving the history and natural resources that make North Branford a special place to live," says Andy.

Built in 1805, the building is the oldest preserved schoolhouse in all of New Haven County, and the fourth oldest in all of Connecticut. Long-time residents of the Northford area may remember field trips to the site to learn about life in a one-room school house. "The goal of this project is to fully repair and restore the school house so it can be appreciated by future generations for years to come," says Totoket Historical Society Board member, Ted Groom. The organization, a 501(c)3 nonprofit, aims to raise \$100,000 to fund this important initiative, and once restored, aims to provide students and families from the surrounding area with unique opportunities for educational programming at the site.

"To have Andy's leadership as Chair for this campaign means the world to our organization. We are beyond grateful to have his industrious spirit, business acumen, and unwavering commitment to the Northford and North Branford community behind our cause. We look forward to seeing the restoration of this iconic site, and hope the community at large will rally in support with us," says Veronica Glass Garrett, Totoket Historical Society Board member. 



State Representative Vincent Candelora Some New Laws to Pay Attention to Starting July



Starting July 1, the beginning of the new fiscal year, a number of new laws took effect in Connecticut that are worth noting. From changes in the state's tax structure to a hike in the minimum hourly rate, the changes took effect as a result of actions by the General Assembly and final approval from the Governor.

The state's tax on diesel fuel increased from 40 cents per gallon to 49 cents which will likely only add to the rising rate of inflation. Truckers will be forced to pass along the added costs that will impact our supply chain.

The changes have also become an issue in the race for governor.

The new state budget however does suspend temporarily the 25-cent tax on gasoline through Nov. 30. Also, motor vehicle taxes will be capped at a lower rate affecting an estimated 75 towns and cities. Crafting tax formulas that do result in winners and losers is never easy. And this change will mean that some motorists will pay more depending on where they live.

Small businesses continue to struggle in the aftermath of the COVID pandemic, and the increase in the state's minimum hourly wage will not make it any easier for them. Starting July1, the wage was increased from \$13 an hour to \$14 under the provisions of the law that was passed in 2019.

The hourly wage will ultimately be indexed to rates set by the federal Department of Labor.






