
When Nick was a young, he joined the Boy Scouts and was initiated into the Order of the Arrow. This was the Scouts National Honor Society who best exemplify the

State Representative Vincent Candelora State's Longstanding Juvenile Crime Problems





Back in early May, when a vehicle with two children inside was stolen from a Cumberland Farms parking lot in Wolcott, a lot of people who had followed the state's juvenile crime crisis figured the headline-grabbing incident might spark a movement in the legislature.

I certainly did, and when it happened again a few days later, this time in Waterbury with a

baby inside an SUV—well, surely that would spur the General Assembly's majority party toward substantive reforms to our state's juvenile justice system. Right?

Wrong.

As I type this, Connecticut is in no better shape than it was at the time of that SUV theft, and since then another vehicle was stolen with a child inside—Manchester.

Yes, that was three such cases in month.

Recently, I called for the General Assembly to hold a special session to tackle this long-standing public safety crisis. It had been a priority for House Republicans ahead of the session's early January start, and we spoke about it often during the five-month period that saw Democrats do next to nothing—simply creating a new penalty for adults who entice juveniles to steal vehicles, rather than doing something to hold persistent teenage offenders accountable.

Among the concepts offered by the Republicans were:

Eliminating the statutory limit of 6 hours that a juvenile can be held in detention without an order from the court;

Including the DCF in the investigation of family circumstances of a repeat offender charged with stealing a car or any offense involving a deadly weapon;

Broadening criteria for a court to deem a juvenile a risk to public safety on a second offense instead of a third;

Evaluating the need for support services for to the individual and/or family By now, you've probably realized those ideas were rejected.

I'm hopeful they'll get a second look soon, though it may come as a result of more crimes: a senior center trashed in Wolcott by teens who stole a car afterward, shots fired at a Glastonbury resident who confronted teen car thieves at her home, and, tragically, a 53-year-old pedestrian struck and killed in New Britain by a stolen vehicle operated by teenagers.

One of those teens had been arrested 13 times within 4 years. Police there, and in Wolcott, say our state's juvenile justice system is broken.

I couldn't agree more, particularly if you consider that it's possible for a 17-year-old to be arrested twice—in two different stolen vehicles—within

five hours.
Yes, that actually happened.

I'll let you know whether majority party Democrats, or Gov. Lamont, answer the Republican call for immediate action on this crisis.

In the meantime, please follow the crucial guidance issued by North Branford police recently: Don't confront criminals rummaging through or even trying to steal your vehicle. Call officers instead and they'll respond immediately.

Is Marijuana the Only Alternative? Why Neurofeedback Should be Considered.

In 2012, Medical Marijuana became legal in Connecticut, and as of July 1, 2021, it is now legal for anyone over the age of 21 to possess and/or use recreational marijuana within our State. From a health perspective, many people use marijuana to help mitigate the symptoms associated with anxiety, to help improve their sleep, and to help decrease chronic pain.

From a neurofeedback perspective, these conditions have a commonality in that they often demonstrate a similar type of brainwave dysfunction — an overactive brain that produces too much of the faster frequencies at the wrong time (the brain is supposed to fluidly shift brainwave activity based on the circumstances). We have been offering neurofeedback therapy since 2010, and have helped many people be better able to manage their anxiety, improve sleep challenges and significantly decrease the chronic pain. It is a safe, effective and non-drug treatment alternative for managing a variety of symptoms that people struggle with, including what we have discussed above. 
