EDITORIAL

State Representative Vincent Candelora **Connecticut still a tough place to do business**



Connecticut businesses continue to struggle as the state incrementally emerges from the pandemic that has stymied economic activity and forced us as a society to adjust to a different way of life.

Small business owners report that they cannot hire new employees or bring previous ones back to work, largely due to over generous unemployment benefits. This is particularly

true for the restaurant industry. This spring bonuses of up to \$2,000 were offered by some.

The governor is fond of pointing out seemingly enhanced or improved business ratings, selectively chosen from one outlet or another to support his dubious claim that the one-party Democrat rule in Hartford is succeeding in restoring economic stability and growth in our state. But try as he might, there is no denying Connecticut's history of poor performance when it comes to the cost of doing business here.

And it is not likely to improve much in the near future when laws such as the so-called truck mileage tax are put on the books as just happened. That tax on large trucks for traveling on state roads and highways is going to increase the cost of goods and services being delivered here and will further add to the inflation consumers are already feeling.

The Connecticut Business and Industry Association, CBIA, the state's largest business group, recently pointed out that the perception of Connecticut as a tough place to do business is tangible. The Democrat-controlled House and Senate in the last few hours of the legislative session in June narrowly approved a bill that will further constrict business on how they can operate, employ people, and stay open.

The law places restrictions on hiring and re-hiring employees who have been laid off during the pandemic, and essentially applies union hiring policies to non-union, private sector shops. For instance, a laid off worker would have to be re-hired not based on merit, but on seniority. These onerous requirements would apply to the companies even if they are sold or moved to another location.

The narrow margins in both legislative chambers indicated that even some Democrats fear backlash from their constituents over this highly controversial vote.

These impediments to allowing employers to operate efficiently and without needless government meddling only add to the high cost of doing business and will constrict economic growth. Connecticut must do more to help Main Street prosper as we continue to emerge out of this pandemic.

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE By Attorney Marc P. Guertin

Often, I am asked "What is the difference between and Irrevocable Trust and a Revocable Trust?" On a base level the answer to the question is easy, one trust is revocable and the other is not. But that does not quite answer the question my clients are really asking. What they really want to know is what type of trust is right for my situation?

Trusts are legal agreements between three different parties: The Grantor, who establishes the trust, the Trustee, who administrates the trust, and the beneficiary, who receives some sort of benefit from the trust.

In many ways revocable trusts and irrevocable trusts are similar. All trusts act like a "legal container" that holds property for the benefit of the "beneficiary" of the trust. The beneficiary can be an individual, an institution or a charity.

Imagine that a trust acts like a cardboard box that holds your assets. Revocable Trusts are an "open box trust." You can put assets into the box and you can take assets out of the box. The box is an alter ego for yourself. You have total control. On the other hand, Irrevocable Trusts function like a "closed box trust." You can put assets into the trust, you just cannot get them out. Your trustee controls the assets inside the Irrevocable Trust, not you.

Revocable Trusts are very good at avoiding the probate process (although not necessarily the probate fees charged by the state of Connecticut). They are also very good at avoiding or minimizing estate taxes, adding an extra level of control after you are gone and become helpful when you are in a blended family. Revocable Trust also can be very helpful if you own property out of state. What a Revocable Trust will not do is protect assets against the high cost of nursing home/skilled nursing care.

When my clients are concerned about the costs associated with spending time in an nursing home we usually discuss the power of an Irrevocable Trust. Irrevocable Trusts are a legal entity separate from the person who creates it. As a "closed box trust," irrevocable trusts insulate the assets inside the trust from things like the cost of nursing home care. In order for an Irrevocable Trust to work it must be set up well in advance of anticipated nursing home care. Irrevocable Trusts offer an opportunity to pass an intact estate to your heirs, even if you have to go into a nursing home.




