

Democracy Demands Dialogue, Not Violence



There's a lot happening at the state capitol lately—debate over using pension funds to buy the Connecticut Sun women's basketball franchise (I have concerns about that idea) and discussions about giving state government more say in local zoning decisions to expand housing stock. But I couldn't use my space in this edition without instead reflecting on the shocking assassination of Charlie Kirk.

Whether you agreed with him or not, most of us would concur that his murder was a vile act. There's no place in our democracy for violence as a means of silencing voices or advancing political causes. The moment we turn to violence to settle our political differences, we abandon the very principles that make our democratic system worth defending. I know we can do better. I've seen us do better.

Most people—neither at the capitol nor here at home—don't know that I'm a member of the Rodel Fellowship. It's a program that brings together 24 elected officials spanning the ideological divide. The diversity of our group is remarkable, ranging from a land commissioner from Texas to the city attorney of San Francisco. Together, we've proven that Americans with vastly different values and perspectives can sit around the same table, engage in meaningful dialogue, and find common ground while staying true to our principles.

We meet in person from time to time in different parts of the country and stay in contact throughout the year. We've studied together, shared meals, and listened to each other's stories. What we discovered shouldn't surprise anyone, yet somehow feels revolutionary in today's political climate: despite our political differences, we share fundamental concerns about serving our communities and strengthening our democracy. Our experience proves that civil discourse isn't just possible—it's essential.

Here in Connecticut, we're fortunate that our legislature has maintained a good track record of bipartisan cooperation. Yes, we disagree on bigger issues like taxes and state spending, and yes, those disagreements dominate headlines. But overall, we usually work together well, preserving an environment where Republicans and Democrats can collaborate. This cooperation doesn't happen by accident—it requires hard work to hash through issues and keep frustrations in check. We're not perfect. Sometimes those frustrations boil over. Thankfully, though, most of us still pick up the phone and have a conversation or share quiet discussions in committee rooms and capitol hallways.

As we reflect on Charlie Kirk's death—and remember the human tragedies that occurred in Minnesota this summer—we must all recommit ourselves to democracy's hard work: the daily choice to engage with those who disagree with us, to listen before we speak, and to find solutions through dialogue rather than division.

In the hours following this shocking crime on the Utah campus, I found hope through our young people. The Young Democrats and Young Republicans organizations issued a joint statement—before the larger state party apparatuses responded—denouncing what occurred. Their swift recognition of the need for unity points the way forward. When the next generation can rise above partisan divisions to defend democratic principles, it reminds us that civil discourse isn't just an ideal—it's an achievable reality. That's the legacy we must build together.

LET'S BE "FRANK"

Well, brother, our four day trip to Montreal turned into a two day trip. We started off on Wednesday afternoon. The ride was beautiful. The leaves are turning in Vermont and there was very little traffic. The Italian restaurant at the hotel was a winner and we had a delicious meal. We got to bed early after the long drive and woke up on Thursday morning to begin the bulk of out excursions.

The *on and off bus tour*, was very nice and informative highlighting the 10 stops that we would try to visit in the next several days. The first stop was the beautiful Notre Dame Basilica. My heart skipped a beat when I first walked in and I teared up a little. It's the most beautiful church I've ever been in.

That's the good news. As I was saying my Rosary in the church, someone lifted my phone and wallet out of SueAnn's purse which had my business credit and debit cards, my license, my insurance cards and my pacemaker ID. Within a half an hour they charged \$15,000 on my charge card and wiped out my checking account.

We called the bank to cancel the cards and Frankie ordered a new phone to be delivered to our house. We then tried to report it to the police which was a nightmare in itself.

After a quick meal we went back to the hotel to make a list of what we had to do to rectify the situation. SueAnn dejectedly insisted we leave Friday and go home. Frankie and I kept telling her, "Don't let the bastards win" After a long sleepless night going over all we had to do, when we woke up I informed SueAnn that the bastards had won and it was time to go home.

The bank insisted we report it to the police which was difficult. After two failed attempts we were directed to another PD. SueAnn went in to file to report and I sat in front of the PD in a no parking area with my Connecticut license plate and no form of ID, just hoping I would not be approached. All I could think of was don't put my hands behind my back with the handcuffs. It would surely pop out my pacemaker.

The ride home was equally enchanting and Saturday was a blur. To order a new license on line the first thing they ask you for is you driver's license number. If I knew the number I wouldn't need a new license.

Trying to get my Medicare and Aetna insurance cards was also difficult. For identity verification the send a text to my phone with a code, Oops, I had no phone. I also spent and hour at the bank where they informed me that the cards were stopped but they didn't fill out a fraud report so we had to take care of that.

When the new phone came I tried to back up the new phone from the I Cloud (my kids had to impatiently explain what the I Cloud was and in my ignorance I hadn't backed it up since last year so everything from June of 2024 was lost.



So I spent the rest of the day catching up on some of of my information and making a list of what I needed to do on Monday. It was a bitter experience and I couldn't get over someone stealing it in the most beautiful church I have ever seen while I was saying a Rosary.

Then it dawned on me that the date was 9-11. With that I relaized it was a minor inconvenience compared to what the families are still going through 24 years later.

Take care my brother and I'll see you soon.

Local author to Speak at North Haven Sons and Daughters of Italy Meeting





Important Dates for the Fall

Leaf Drop-Off opens – Saturday October 18th.

Scrap Metal Pickup – week of October 20th.

Electronics collection at Public Works – Saturday 11-1

Bulky Waste Pickup – week of November 3rd.

Hazwaste Central is open for the season until October 25th Safe & Free Disposal of Residential Household Hazardous Waste

The Regional Water Authorities' HazWaste Central will be open on Saturdays through mid-October.

Now is the time to drop off your hazardous waste. There are no lines and it takes about 5 minutes in-and-out. If you wait until October, the lines will be longer.

HazWaste Central helps area residents in member towns protect water quality by safely disposing of household wastes. Located at RWA at 90 Sargent Drive in New Haven, HazWaste Central is open from <u>9 a.m.</u> <u>until noon on Saturdays only</u>. Household hazardous waste comes from everyday products used in the home, garage, yard or garden.

A visit to HazWaste Central is quick and easy. Participants never have to leave their cars, and the waste is off-loaded by professionals. Some of the household wastes that can be dropped off include aerosol cleaners and sprays, antifreeze, oil-based paint and pool chemicals. We also list some of the accepted items on your yellow trash information card.

Pact Collective

Have you been tossing your empty mascara tubes, makeup palettes, and more in your trash or recycling bin? You might be surprised to learn that most beauty packaging isn't accepted through curbside recycling programs. Pact Collective is a nonprofit on a mission to close the loop on hard-to-recycle packaging waste in the beauty and wellness industries.

What can I drop off?

PLASTIC - Must be 2x2 inches or smaller - small tubes, bottles, jars, caps, lipstick, lip gloss, mascara tubes, wands, and applicators, eyeliner, brow, and lip pencils, pumps, dispensers.

COLORED GLASS - Small bottles, jars.

MIXED MATERIALS - Palettes, compacts, pumps, dental floss containers.

So how does it work?

- 1. Clean out your empties.
- 2. Visit most beauty stores and discard your unbagged empties in the Pact bin (hint: it's usually near checkout).




