

State Representative Vincent Candelora **Opioid Reforms Are Still Needed**



On January 9th, the General Assembly took the oath of office. I will be serving on the Education, Finance Revenue and Bonding, Public Health and General Law Committees. Over the past month, I've meet with parents who have lost their children to drug overdoses. In the past decade, we certainly have seen this crisis rise to alarming levels.

Thankfully, people are more willing to talk about their experiences, and the legislature has made some important changes to our prescription drug laws to limit access to abuse. According to the Department of Health and Human Services, 130 people die from opioid overdoses daily. Nearly, 80% of heroin users reported misusing prescription drugs prior to using heroin, and among the more than 72,000 drug overdoses in 2017, the biggest increase occurred among deaths related to fentanyl and synthetic opioids, which totaled over 30,000 deaths.

I am supporting a law to increase the penalties for selling fentanyl and synthetic opioids. Currently, under Connecticut law, individuals caught selling these drugs receives lighter sentencing than dealing other controlled substances, like cocaine. Penalties alone won't solve the problem, however.

Over the past few years, Connecticut has made naloxone more accessible to the overdose patients by allowing the drug to be administered by police, emergency personnel and laypeople. The drug can be obtained over the counter and is effective to reverse the effects of an overdose. When administered, however, patients may experience opioid-withdrawal syndrome, which can include agitation, drug craving, vomiting and violent behavior. Often times, patients will leave the hospital seeking more drugs to offset the withdrawal symptoms. After the mass overdosing on the New Haven green, many people heard the stories of narcan being administered two or three times to the same patient in one day. One might think that the addiction was driving these people to return to drug use, but it likely was an effort to counter these severe withdrawal symptoms.

This session, I will be beginning the conversation with how the state can help regulate the administration of naloxone and offer services to alleviate these withdrawal symptoms so that patients are immediately seeking the same drug that almost led to their death the first time. Connecticut needs to examine whether residents should have the ability to involuntarily commit their loved ones for short or long term drug addiction treatment because while the proliferation of naloxone may be saving lives, it is not reducing the number of overdoses in our state.

February has Valentine's Day. March has St Patrick's. April has Easter and the start of baseball. May has Memorial Day and the start of summer. June has the St. Anthony Festival although after forever, we won't have one this year because our pastor has canceled it. July has the Fourth of July, August is vacation month, and September has Labor Day even if Jerry Lewis is gone. October is canning month and November is Thanksgiving and it's December and Christmas is here again.

So seriously, what the hell do we have in January. They even took the super Bowl away and pushed that to February. Even the NFL knows January sucks. Maybe we should make April a thirty one day month and take a day away from January. At least we won't have to suffer through thirty one days.

I have no solutions but if anyone else does I'd be more than happy to hear them.

On another note I am very grateful for the many readers who have demonstrated their support for the Totoket Times with voluntary payments. The support and positive comments are heartwarming. I must say it is a bit embarrassing when people stop me at an event or in the store and hand me money, but in my situation I've been embarrassed many times.

The Fall of the Fourth Estate

The words and phrases used by the Corporate Media seem to increasingly resonate as the networks cover the same stories with alarmingly similar phrases, inflections and perspectives that affect, define or contradict our perception of reality. 




