

State Representative Vincent Candelora

Thank you for Returning Me to Hartford, the Work Begins Already. . .



I want to first take the opportunity to thank the voters of the 86th District for returning me to Hartford to represent all of you. It has been an honor serving our great community, and I appreciate the strong vote of confidence that you provided me. I also want to thank the many volunteers who knocked doors, stood out at the polls and wrote letters in support of my candi-

dacy. Finally, I want to thank my family who continue to support this journey of public service despite how much it disrupts our family life.

Throughout the election, I have strongly opposed tolls in Connecticut despite many residents supporting the notion. Governor-elect Lamont wanted tolls for trucks only and some candidates wanted discounted pricing for residents. When I met with the Commissioner of DOT last year, he indicated that the special transportation fund needed an additional \$1 billion in order to remain solvent so I knew the proposal would be much more comprehensive. It is also disappointing that members of the bond commission and candidates supported the \$10 million toll study the Governor insisted that we needed to complete. The fact that months later, the Commissioner of DOT put out this comprehensive toll proposal without a \$10 million study begs the question on whether this money was necessary to approve and spend.

The current toll proposal calls for 82 tolls throughout the state. These gantries will be spaced approximately every 6-7 miles on highways including Interstates 84, 95, 91, and 395 and Routes 2, 9, 8, 11 and 15, among others. From the report, peak rates for drivers are estimated to be 7.9 cents per mile, with a discount down to 5.5 cents per mile for Connecticut commuters, although the rates change depending on time of day and the type of E-Z Pass. A single, one-way trip on I-95 from New York to New Haven during peak hours will cost \$2.11 or \$4.22 for a round trip. That could equal \$21.10 per week for a regular commuter with a CT E-Z Pass commuter discount. Heavy trucks could pay as much as 47.3 cents per mile, under the plan. Depending upon your commute or nature of your business, you might be paying up to \$1,100 per year for tolls. The Yankee Institute at yankeeinstitute. org provides some good summaries on the impact of these tolls.

I am also concerned about the impact this proposal could have on a town like North Branford. Gantries will exist on the highways in Branford, Madison, Guilford, North Haven and Wallingford. Route 80, 17 and 22 will become a major corridor to avoid tolls. Undoubtedly, commuters to New Haven will choose Route 80 rather than paying tolls on the highway. Trucks will cut through North Branford to avoid the 95/91 toll sections. Tolls are not just about money. It is about quality of life. Traffic patterns will change, and our quiet rural community, tucked into the corner of New Haven country, may become congested with traffic under this proposal.

I will continue to listen to the debate, and I understand the transportation fund has financial issues. I refuse to solve the problem with a proposal that takes more money out of residents pockets and that negatively impacts our quality of life.

Let's Be "Frank"

This year the Totoket Times with the support of our advertisers and readers was able to donate ad space to many local organizations. Youth and high school sports, Matts Mission, Potato and Corn Festival, Women's Club, Rotary, North Branford Parks, Recreation and Seniors, local churches, schools, North Branford Education Foundation, Totoket Historical Society, and the Chamber of Commerce are only a few of the organizations we have helped in their mission to serve the community.

We have been able to again do this without raising rates to advertisers even though newsprint has gone up three times and those increases have been passed on to yours truly. We have also lost several of our long time advertisers due to social media advertising. With all of these obstacles, I still believe there is a place in this community for the printed word.

For the first time that I can remember, I have had to use personal funds to continue with our town newspaper. I am not complaining but now more than ever your help is needed to keep the Totoket Times in circulation. It's time to step up and don't expect your neighbor to carry the ball, or just be comfortable with the thought that the Totoket Times will always be here. Between print and postage, each issue cost more than \$1,600 to get this paper to your mailboxes. That expense does not include office supplies, phone, computer expenses or time and effort.

It is once again time to ask for your voluntary payment of at least \$10. To keep the Times a float. This is not a donation. It is a Voluntary Payment to help keep our advertising rates reasonable to assist our struggling local businesses, and to help our neighbors get their message out to 6,500 homes and businesses in North Branford and Northford, as well as our website so people who have moved out of our town an still catch up on what's going on.

I thank you in advance for your support and hope to continue this paper for years to come.







Stress, anxiety, and depression are all wrapped up in what we have experienced through our lives. Some people reach out for help from our medical community or mental health professionals and some of us live with the culture of "We don't talk about it." or "Walk it off." Or "You'll be fine."

The East Shore District Health Department (ESDHD) is teaming up with its partners, the libraries in Branford, East Haven and North Branford, to bring to the community free screenings of RESILIENCE: THE BIOLOGY OF STRESS AND THE SCIENCE OF HOPE, a film about childhood trauma and the adverse effects on health over a lifetime — and the role that everyone in the community can play in reversing them.

When ESDHD surveyed the residents of the communities of Branford, North Branford and East Haven, in 2016, about their health a shocking statistic was revealed. When asked if they have been told by a health professional that they have either anxiety or depression, 20% of the respondents answered that they had. This was a relatively large proportion of people who admitted to having mental health struggles. There are not mental health professionals at the health department, but we are involved in population health and addressing health threats that affect a large proportions of the community. In creating the Community Health Improvement Plan, the staff at ESDHD questioned, "How can this be addressed?"

The documentary "Resilience" opens our eyes to the fact that many people were raised with childhood traumas. The Adverse Childhood Effects (or ACES) survey has revealed to us how are common these traumas are in our communities. What is not common knowledge, is the effect that these childhood traumas have on our brains and how they are wired.

The health department urges everyone to see this film. In this world of hate and "My opinion counts more than yours," we can only improve as a community if we start to understand ourselves and treat each other with compassion, respect and understanding.

The new 22 acre preserve, now owned by NBLCT, is tucked quietly away at the end of North Street next to Regional Water Authority land in North Branford's Historic District. The former owners, Dudley and Vicky Harrison, raised cattle and farmed the land for more than 50 years, but were probably best known for their maple syrup made from sugar maples on the property and boiled in their own sugarhouse. In the open end of one of their barns next to a hayfield was the "Store" where anyone at any time could buy hand-filled jugs of the sweet and sticky syrup.
