Connecticut's Borrowing: One Way To Close The Budget Gap



Three of Wall Street's four credit rating agencies have maintained Connecticut's general obligation bond outlook as "negative". While Moody's believes that Connecticut will resolve our budget problems by making spending reductions, in a statement, they "believe that the weakening demographics will continue and place negative pressure on the state's economy and finances in the next few years, while the very high fixed costs reduce flexibility and present additional challenges." Connecticut's arteries are beginning to harden and while there is time to turn things around, it's going to take a change in diet and lifestyle.

Connecticut has relied upon the wealthy and the stock market to generate much of its tax revenue. Recently the Hartford Courant reported that 15 billionaires pay almost 12% of all taxes. Two of those billionaires have just moved out of state. We don't need math to realize that this trend is a problem; and in fact, the Commissioner of Revenue Services testified once in the Finance Committee that DRS reaches out to these people on a regular basis and monitors their movements. In my opinion, last year's increases to the trust and estate tax helped encourage these two individuals to leave and I fear the others may follow. It is no surprise that the Governor proposed eliminating those estate tax increases in this year's budget.

For the past five years, I've sponsored a bill to restrict the use of stock market gains in budgeting. Finally, last year, we passed that bill into law so Connecticut can no longer take a steep increase in stock market revenue gains and use it to increase its operating budget. That money will now automatically be diverted to pay off long-term liabilities or go into a savings account. While this measure won't provide immediate budget relief, it will certainly help in future budgets.

The Governor and Republican legislators believe that we need to close this budget deficit without raising taxes. It will be a difficult task, but it can be done. One area that hasn't garnered enough discussion is our debt service. While debt service, i.e. your mortgage payment, is a fixed number, Connecticut can greatly reduce this cost by borrowing less. In 2010, before Governor Malloy took office, our annual borrowing for general obligations ranged between \$800 million to \$1.2 billion. Since 2010, Governor Malloy has ramped up borrowing to approximately \$2 billion annually. If the state cuts borrowing in half, returning it to 2010 levels, we will see \$60 million in savings in the first year and by the tenth year over \$900 million annually. Connecticut must change its diet and lifestyle. Given our fiscal situation, it is a small step that will produce huge saving down the road, and it is my hope we can adopt this measure.

There were tears and jeers, great food, great fun and we raised close to \$4,000 to continue with our grant programs which help to fund some of our special programs for students.

Walking towards that new decade, I thought I'd try to slow down, but SueAnn seems to be getting younger. She signed us up to be contestants on the "Not so Newlyweds" night at the Sons & Daughters of Italy. It was funny but not pretty. It's amazing how after close to thirty five years of marriage, we don't know a thing about each other. If they asked us questions about the kids we probably would have aced it but to ask us about each other was a bit over the top. The good news was we didn't come in last. The good news for SueAnn was that several people questioned the fact that we were married so long. They felt that SueAnn was much younger than me and not old enough to be married that long. As usual I took the credit for taking such good care of her through the years.

Finally, pitchers and catchers for high school baseball begins this week. I'm looking forward to being with the kids and I hope this year my health stays better than it was last year. It's a tough two month stretch. As the varsity assistant and the jv head coach, I have a game every day for about sixth weeks. I am starting to get too old for this stuff. Flood Map Revisions

FEMA, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, is in the process of revising Flood Maps for the Quinnipiac Watershed, which includes watersheds within the Town of Branford and North Branford, including the Farm River, Burrs Brook, Munger Brook, the Branford River, and miscellaneous tributaries. The hydraulics of the Farm River and Branford River were restudied in detail as part of the Quinnipiac Watershed study. In addition, new topography was acquired and utilized in the study and mapping of the watershed.

Preliminary revised maps based upon the new study and dated 8/10/2015 are available for review in the Town Engineers’ offices in Branford and

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

Lately, the same question has been posed to me by several of my clients “What is the difference between and Irrevocable Trust and a Revocable Trust?” On a base level the answer to the question is easy, one trust is revocable and the other is not. But that does not quite answer the question my clients are really asking. What they really want to know is what type of trust is right for my situation?

In many ways revocable trusts and irrevocable trusts are similar. All trusts act like a “legal container” that holds property for the benefit of the “beneficiary” of the trust. The beneficiary can be an individual, an institution or a charity. Trusts are legal agreements between three different parties: The Grantor, who establishes the trust, the Trustee, who administrates the trust, and the beneficiary, who receives some sort of benefit from the trust.

Imagine that a trust acts like a cardboard box that holds your assets. Revocable Trusts are an “open box trust.” You can put assets into the box and you can take assets out of the box. The box is an alter ego for yourself. You have total control. On the other hand, Irrevocable Trusts function like a “closed box trust.” You can put assets into the trust, you just cannot get them out. Your trustee controls the assets inside the Irrevocable Trust, not you.

Revocable Trusts are very good at avoiding the probate process (although not necessarily the probate fees charged by the state of Connecticut). They are also very good at avoiding or minimizing estate taxes, and are beneficial in many other ways. What a Revocable Trust will not do is protect assets against the high cost of nursing home/skilled nursing care.

If my clients are concerned about the costs associated with spending time in an nursing home we usually discuss the power of an Irrevocable Trust. Irrevocable Trusts are a legal entity separate from the person who creates it. As a “closed box trust,” irrevocable trusts insulate the assets inside the trust from things like the cost of nursing home care. In order for an Irrevocable Trust to work it must be set up well in advance of anticipated nursing home care.

Available maps indicate revised flood limits, the increased or decreased area of the flood zone, and the projected depth of flooding within the mapped area. **ALL RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES CURRENTLY WITHIN OR NEAR THE DESIGNATED FLOOD ZONES ARE ENCOURAGED TO INSPECT THE REVISED MAPS TO SEE IF THE REVISIONS WILL IMPACT THEIR PROPERTY.**

There is a 90 day appeal period to review the maps and studies and to provide comments to FEMA. The appeal period commenced on February 11, 2016 and will end on May 11, 2016. The revisions may result in a requirement to obtain flood insurance for some properties or eliminate the need for flood insurance for other properties. Also, properties that may no longer require flood insurance may consider retaining flood insurance protection, which should be at a significantly reduced cost. North Branford High School Students Give BIG!

What would you do with \$1.00? Students at North Branford High School know exactly what *they* would do – they would GIVE BIG. That's right. For the fourth time since 2010, students are participating in the “Big Give,” a project that challenges students to make a symbolic dollar “grow” through creative fundraising efforts.

The Big Give, led by faculty members Stephanie Byrd, Jessica Barbato, and Megan Bishop is modeled after Oprah Winfrey's 2008 initiative. Students embarked upon the same challenge in 2010, 2012, and 2014, and have raised nearly \$40,000 for worthy causes to date. In 2010, students were even awarded a *Challenge to Educational Citizenship Award* from the State Student Advisory Council on Education and Connecticut's Commissioner of Education.

One advisory, Stephanie Byrd, believes that this project, along with so many others at the high school, is a true reflection of the school's mission: “At NBHS, we stress the importance of civic and social responsibility; the Big Give is a perfect opportunity for the students to engage in a project that allows them to pay it forward and give back.”

In the past, students were able to select any global, national, or local cause to fundraise for; this year, however, the advisors asked that students select a local cause in order to bring efforts “closer to home.” According to Jessica Barbato, “We decided to focus our efforts locally so that we can better connect students to their community and show them that their efforts have a real, tangible impact. We've observed that the North Branford community is quick to support our students and schools, and this seems like the perfect opportunity for us to give back.” This year's recipients will include Matt's Mission Fund, The Food Pantry of North Branford, the Compassion Club, two local families in need, our local libraries and VFW, and others.

For approximately twelve weeks, the students (working individually or in small teams) will come up with creative ways to fundraise. Additionally, the students will reach out to local businesses and organizations, families, friends, neighbors, and anyone else who wants to help them GIVE BIG. Advisor Megan Bishop knows the impact a small community can have on a project such as the Big Give: “North Branford is an immensely caring community. Having grown up in the town, I can recall countless instances when our community has gathered together to help people, families, and organizations in need. We hope that the residents and businesses of North Branford will show their support for the Big Give; together we can truly make a difference.”
