

Leadership Means Making Tough Decisions By: State Representative Vincent Candelora



The 2017 legislative session has been one like no other. I have yet to experience a session like this in my 11 years of serving the 86th District. It started when the legislature was unable to pass a budget by the end of the fiscal year on June 30th. Then, the Speaker of the House set a new target budget deadline of Tuesday, July 18th, and that too came and

went without a budget or a vote. Now the Speaker is calling us in on July 24th to only vote on the state union concession package without a budget.

What does this all mean for us? In short, the governor is running the state through executive orders, and if the SEBAC agreement passes, the state will be locked into a concession package without a budget so our most vulnerable population will still go with reduced or no services. This concession package, while it contains substantial savings, falls short of providing the proper structural changes to put Connecticut on a path of stability. I will predict again that Connecticut is poised for more tax increases and state workers eventually will see their pensions fall into insolvency.

I joined my colleagues in the House in putting forth not one, but seven balanced budget proposals, which increase school aid, preserve municipal funding, reject the proposed shift of \$400 million in teacher pension payments to municipalities, and include no tax increases, among other things. Our budget does call for more concession from state workers because we have no other option. Connecticut offers one of the most generous health care plans in the world. It's so good that Senator Murphy and Blumenthal opted to stay on the state plan, rather than taking the one offered by Congress! To make the fiscal situation in our state worse, the union concession plan put forth by the governor and his office provides a "no layoff" provision for four years and extends the agreement another five years. The state will not go over thirty years without having fully negotiated a new union contract! It's important to note that this contract was negotiated solely by the governor and his office with the state employee unions. This deal prevents any state employee layoffs, secures wage increases, allows for no increases in co-pays, saves longevity pay by delaying the April 2018 payment until July 18th and extends current healthcare and retirement benefits from 2022 to 2027.

The budget package that I worked to put together with my colleagues in the House balanced the state's finances, made long-term changes and put together a concession package that did not seek to extend the state's burden for ten more years. State workers have commented that I am "anti-union" and that could not be further from the truth. Connecticut has lost almost ten thousand state jobs over the past ten years. The failure to make necessary structural changes will only lead to more job loss. Union leadership is not doing their membership any favors in the long run, and sadly, if approved, this agreement will lead to more taxes for Connecticut and more mass exodus.

Let's Be "Frank"

Well my brother, I am writing this letter with a heavy heart. I'm sure you know by now, that our sister has left my world and joined yours. After several setbacks in the rehabilitation center or as I have begun to call it "The meat market", Mary couldn't fight any longer. Her heart that was bigger than any I know simply gave out. It's amazing that she rallied so many times to the point that we thought she would be fine. She took care of business that she needed to take care of and when she was out of the woods and ready to start another chapter in her life she just left us.

Her family and many friends are devastated. My phone hasn't stopped ringing as I search for the solitude to mourn. The wake was four hours of non stop visitors and when I have a moment I will yell at her for the way my back, knees and feet feel from having to stand all that time. The funeral was even a better send off, as there were more people in Church for her service, than there were at Sunday Mass. Three priests on the altar and all her nieces and nephews and her favorite brother (sorry bro, I still call them as I see them) all partaking in the service.

Our sister wasn't involved in numerous causes. That was our style. Her loves were simply her family, her friends and her church. But to that group she gave of herself fully and passionately.

Following her first near death episode after being home for only a few days, she convinced her friend to pick her up for and early Sunday morning meeting, attended Mass, took part in the service as a Eucharistic Minister, attended my grand son Nico's baptism and the party as well. "I'm okay," she insisted even though we could see she wasn't.

After a car accident almost killed her less than a month following her health issue, even as she suffered through rehab she would badger me. "Did you call Bill and tell him I was here? Was there a good crowd at the church today? How are my babies? Did you go see cousin Ronnie in the hospital?" The questions went on and on.

There was no separating her loves. Her family, friends and church were all at the top of the list and she would drop anything to help them. She was aunt Mary to most (young and old) and she was always there to give whatever she had as well as things she didn't have.

She loved her family particularly her nieces and nephews. The world has lost a gentle heart, but a heart that was bigger than most. She was a person who touched so many lives in her own small circle but she left a great impression on all she touched.

I make no apologies if this paper is worse than usual this issue. I started putting it together after I said good bye to her in the hospital and I am finishing it (late I might add) the evening of her funeral. Mary was my first proof reader (until her eyes got bad) and I still called her during the preparation for most issues to ask her questions. "Is it affect or effect?" "How do you spell receive?" "Where does the apostrophe go?" And the list goes on and on. I alerady miss her beyond what words can describe.

Well that's it for now my brother. Take good care of Mary. Tell her I love her and I'll be with the both of you soon. **Not too soon.**




