State Representative Vincent Candelora An October Surprise: Taxes on Groceries



As if the plastic bag tax wasn't confusing enough, on October 1, grocery shopping will take on a scavenger hunt like atmosphere where shoppers will be paying a 7.35% tax on some groceries, but not others. In the latest budget, Democrats have trampled on a sacred cow, the tax exemption for groceries. No matter how much or little

money people make, they need to eat. Recognizing the regressive nature of certain taxes, lawmakers always have protected groceries from taxation. Sadly, the government appetite for more revenue is now impacting the food you put on your table.

When some democrats proposed raising the tax by one percent on meals at restaurants, they justified the increase as a luxury tax. Eating out is a choice, and if people can afford to go to a restaurant, they should not feel the impact of a one percent tax on meals. When the language was drafted however, they included "grocery stores" as one of the entities that sells meals subject to additional taxation. Meals unfortunately is defined as all "food products which are furnished . . . in a form and in such portions that they are ready for immediate consumption." Every food product, therefore, in a grocery store is now subject to tax scrutiny.

So what foods at a grocery store are in a form that is immediately consumable? The Department of Revenue Service has issued a non-binding, advisory opinion which lists some examples, such as five or less muffins, donuts and bagels, salads in packaging 8 ounces or less, cans of soup, nutrition bars, cooked rack of ribs or rotisserie chickens, sandwiches, and popsicles. Because this opinion is advisory only, grocery stores are left to determine what items will be subject to tax. With the grim reaper of a tax audit over their shoulder, grocery stores are going to air on the side of caution and put a 7.35% sales tax on any items that might fall under this definition.

To add more confusion, if a shopper purchases any of these items along with sodas, bottled water or other beverages, those beverage items will now become taxable at 7.35% whereas if purchased alone, they'd be subject to no taxation. Why? Because the new law taxes all "meals" sold by a "grocery store" "and spiritous, . . . soft drinks, sodas or beverages . . . in connection therewith." So now like a communicable disease, taxation may infect other items because of something else in your cart.

Because this 7.35% tax on groceries targets small portioned food items, I am concerned of the impact on our senior citizens, empty nesters and young men and women living alone. Over the last decade, Connecticut's tax policy represents an incremental creep that affects every aspect of our lives. I share



the public's frustration with these October surprises, but please try not to take it out on the cashiers, bring your reuseable bags and when in doubt, buy in bulk and call your legislators.

Let's Be "Frank"

At this time last year, I was in Italy. It was a trip I never wanted to go on and a trip I will never forget. Influenced by our deceased sister (don't try to figure it our) and my kids, I went kicking and screaming. All of my fears were met head on and they were all more exaggerated in my mind then in actuality.

And I will never forget the admonishments of our Tour Director, Yolanda from Wooster Travel. "This isn't a vacation people. You want a vacation you should have gone to the beach". She reminded us of this on several occasions when we complained of being tired and weary. Salt in he wounds.

This being said, it was all worth those experiences as I will never forget the enjoyment we had on this tour. I am still enjoying the wine of Tuscany as I now order it by the case from the Winery/Restaurant we visited. Also, I can never have olive oil again unless it comes from that same winery.

I fell in love with fresh figs as we were there during fig season. I now visit Country Farms II on a semi weekly basis until the season is over. I have even experimented with a fresh fig stuffed with walnuts and sprinkled with cinnamon and microwaved for 15 seconds. It taste like candy.

How cannot I forget the boat rides to Positano and Amalfi. The beauty of the water and the mountains cannot be sensed through photos and stories. The lemoncello and gelato and pastry were well worth the risk of a high blood sugar. The wlaking will burn it off I told myself.

I learned that pasta can be just as good with a light and quick sauce rather than the heavy four hour sauce with tons of pork and beef (although I must admit I still love my Sunday sauce).

I learned about a simple hardworking life that seemed to be more enjoyable than what we are accustomed to. Our ancestors were, and the people of their homeland are trained in the belief that a hard days work with a good profit but quality merchandise including food, leather, glassware and much more, is the way of a successful life. The craftsmanship is not matched any where and they take great pride in it. I don't think we even try.

The bread and Italian pastry is unparalleled. Believe me, I have gone to many places to try to find some that are even close but I have been unsuccessful. It has been easy for me to cut down on bread and pastry now that I am home because there isn't any that is comparable.

It was truly a remarkable experience and it has given me the urge to travel a bit more than I ever wanted to in the past. I still cringe over my physical setbacks but I have decided not to let that get me down. As the next edition of the Totoket Times comes out, if all goes well, I will be in Aruba. Hopefully while we are relaxing on the beach, I can facebook my dear Yolanda and let her know that I am finally on a vacation. But I'm sure she will remind me as I am basking in the sun, that it will be nothing compared to Italy, and she will be correct.

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE By Attorney Marc P. Guertin

Clients often ask me if they should discuss their estate plans with their adult (or nearly adult) children. As long as your kids are not anxiously waiting for you to die or actively planning your demise, there are many benefits to discussing your plans with your children. Talking about your estate plan with your children can eliminate surprises after you die.

A quick conversation can ensure family harmony long after you are gone. Whether you have a plan in place or are considering putting an estate plan into place, family get-togethers provide the perfect opportunity for such discussions.

Communication is the key to a successful family meeting. When speaking with your children explain the: who, what, when, where, how and WHY of your estate plan.
