

State Representative Vincent Candelora Connecticut's New Normal: Another Deficit



As you've all probably heard by now, the state has fallen into another budget deficit. It has become the new normal. As a result of the latest downturn, the Governor finally reached out to the Republicans for bipartisan talks to close the budget gap. Agreeing to enter into talks was a tough one. In the spring, Republi-

cans offered their own budget proposal which was summarily rejected by Democrats, and in the dead of night, they rammed through a budget that raised taxes to an unprecedented level. After only three months, the budget is out of balance to the tune of over \$350 million. Many argue that the Governor merely wants to get the Republicans' fingerprints on the "murder weapon", and, therefore, Republicans should not engage in any talks.


I believe that is the easy position to take, but it's not the right one; hence, Republican leaders have agreed to offer solutions to this budget crisis and work toward a bipartisan agreement to close our deficit. We have an obligation to the state and our districts to solve this problem.

After many weeks of work, we have outlined a two-tiered proposal. Our plan curbs spending by \$372.8 million this fiscal year in order to close the current shortfall, which is estimated anywhere from \$118 million to \$330 million. We restore earlier cuts to hospitals and programs for the developmentally disabled and mentally ill. We seek to eliminate the unitary tax and some other corporate taxes proposed in the last budget which has resulted in businesses threatening to move jobs out of state.

The second tier of our proposal focuses on long-term structural changes to budget practices. We propose putting a hard cap on state borrowing. We seek to define the spending cap in statute so future legislators can no longer ignore the constitutional spending cap that was adopted to control spending when Connecticut implemented the income tax. We propose a constitutional "lock box" on transportation funding so that all money raised for transportation cannot be diverted to the General Fund, rather it must be used on transportation needs.

We also seek to mitigate larger deficits brewing in future years by asking state employee unions to consider a wide array of concessions. These include requiring all non-hazardous duty workers to contribute 4 percent of their salary toward their pensions; capping cost-of-living adjustments to future retirees' pensions; calculating pensions using only base salaries so that vacation and overtime would be excluded; developing a new, hybrid retirement plan that relies partly on a defined contribution for new workers, similar to the system recently adopted in Rhode Island.; suspending longevity payments for all workers after April 2016; increasing state employee health and dental insurance premiums by 10 percent; and increasing drug co-payments for both existing employees and retirees.

Given that Connecticut faces another almost \$3 billion dollar deficit in the next biennium, we must look at the long term structural issues in our budgeting practices. It is my hope that the Democrats will join us in these discussions, and we anxiously await their ideas to fix Connecticut without raising anymore taxes.

Anthony Candelora, Al Rose and Rose Angeloni joined Doody as republican Council members. Three term Mayor Candelora retained a spot on the Council but lost the top spot and Deputy Mayor and long time Mayor and Councilor Joanne Wentworth was not elected.




T-Birds Win 34 - 6 on Senior Night

Rebuilt in 1908, this beautiful historic edifice is the centerpiece of the Village of Northford and is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Thus far the Church has raised \$34,790 of the estimated \$65,000 needed to complete the project. The bell tower project entails the building of a new bell tower and steeple in modern materials, reinforced support for the bell, and the return of the bell for another century of faithful service.
