

reasons, but for consistency as well.

We need to subscribe to the philosophy that less is more, and in the case of legislative work, I believe that to be the case. Over the years, our legislature has expanded committees, thus compartmentalizing its work. In just the past ten years, the legislature created free standing committees to deal with housing, children, veteran and elderly issues, which previous were handled by others. For instance, in the past, the Planning and Development Committee handled housing issues. This committee oversees municipal and planning regulations, including landlord-tenant laws. By creating a Housing Committee, the legislature has removed a leg of the stool, and now these committees operate in silos. One committee may propose a change to the housing laws that completely contradicts the direction that the other committee may be going in. By sending out competing bills, the committees create chaos for the House and Senate to try and resolve on the floor of the chambers, which is the last place, not the first, a bill should be resolved.

I believe by combining committees, we can bring symmetry to the process. For instance, we often hear how Connecticut is business unfriendly. One of the problems arise because we have a labor committee addressing workers' issues and a separate commerce committee that deals with business issues. Each committee fails to work in tandem for the benefit of the entire business committee and oftentimes, they will produce legislative proposals that can be at complete odds with each other. The unions will influence the labor committee proposals and the business community will attempt to impact the commerce committee proposals. Neither work together. If Connecticut combined these two committee, I believe we would benefit from the centralized dialogue of both business and labor on all the issues.

Our current budget process provides an Appropriations Committee, which fixes the spending side of the budget, and a Finance, Revenue and Bonding Committee, which address the income side of the budget. Each committee will pass out a proposal that fails to match the other. As a result, the legislative committee process will produce a budget that's out of balance. By doing so, the budget goes behind closed doors and gets adjusted by leadership. Oftentimes, the ultimate budget looks nothing like the proposals that come out of these two committees. Republicans have again proposed the creation of a Ways and Means Committee that would be charged with balancing the proposed budget that is produced out the Appropriations Committee. I would hope that this new process would make the process transparent and prevent the decisions from being made behind closed doors.

I not think we will achieve the aggressive proposal of consolidating 27 committees into 17, but I do believe the request merits a discussion. Not only can Connecticut save money, but I believe there is a real opportunity to unify the process for the betterment of the state.

For the week of Dec. 5 - 11, the North Branford Public Libraries will forgive \$1. in overdue fines for every non-expired, non-perishable food item brought in. This only applies to overdue fines, not to bills for lost or damaged items. Bring your canned goods or items in boxes or bags to the library circulation desk. No open, repackaged, or expired items, please. All donations will go to the North Branford Food Pantry. The most needed items are canned fruit, jelly (other than grape), boxed rice, canned potatoes and beef soup; however, all items are gratefully accepted.






