Auditor of Public Accounts: An Unnoticed Government Function



The latest round of tax hikes and tolls from Governor Lamont and his trusted teammates in the legislature captured most of the year's headlines, but Connecticut residents have reason to be concerned about some stuff that didn't get the same level of media attention.

For example, a report issued in October detailed how more than \$260,000 in checks

submitted to the Department of Agriculture went uncashed for months. More recently, another report shed light on a labor organization's misuse of money in a fund created to support workers affected by the horrific tragedy at Sandy Hook elementary school.

Those investigations, and others like them, were conducted by the state's Auditors of Public Accounts (APA.) It's a legislative agency that's under the direction of two state auditors appointed by the General Assembly. Its professional staff includes certified public accountants, certified information system auditors, certified internal auditors, and certified fraud examiners.

The APA performs important work, and their reports offer legislators and the public—valuable insight into the mechanics of state government. Considering that, you may be surprised to know lawmakers rarely get the chance to ask questions about those reports in a formal setting. Despite a state law that requires it, Democrats who control relevant committees don't hold these hearings.

State law requires committees of cognizance and the Government Administration and Elections Committee to hold hearings within 180 days from the time reports are submitted to the legislature. As it stands, there are nearly 40 reports that are overdue for hearings. There's more to be heard in the near future, too.

Examples of problems outlined in APA reports include:

- Abuse of overtime
- Workplace violence complaints
- Massive financial reporting errors
- Benefits payments to deceased individuals
- IT security issues

So often, lawmakers who control the purse strings at the capitol stay there behind the wheel of a threadbare government—that they've cut all the fat from the two-year \$40 billion budget. Reports from the APA, alone, tell us otherwise. If a state employee is allowed to skirt established telecommuting guidelines and work part-time from new home in Florida—just long enough to qualify for state retirement benefits—surely there are more ways to save money.

I believe legislators should be able to ask questions about situations such

Hands in the Pot of Gold

Here's some evidence that strongly suggests our US politicians have their hands in the proverbial pot of gold that is our US foreign aid. The US disbursed \$1.3 billion to Ukraine between 2014 and 2016, hundreds of millions going directly to the Ukraine's energy industry. Congress approved the first billion in March, 2014, after which millions were paid to the Bidens and the Kerrys from the Ukrainian natural gas company, Burisma Holdings. So, this is a 1 + 2 = 3 scenario: (1) our tax money went to the Ukraine, earmarked for its energy industry; (2) the Ukraine then gave much of that US aid to it's natural gas industry; (3) the politicians responsible for getting that US aid to the Ukraine's natural gas industry then received millions from the Ukraine's natural gas industry. Further evidence of wrongdoing = anyone who tries to investigate these obvious and direct connections is spurned, rebuffed, fired or impeached!

The Obama administration was central to the disappearance of billions of dollars in other questionable circumstances as well. Obama deposited 1.5 billion in cash onto a runway in Iran, untraceable money that literally could have go anywhere, subject only to the will of those in on the deal. The Obama administration also had access to billions in Libya when henchwoman Hillary strangely boasted, "We came, we saw, he died," lording over the brutal murder of Gaddafi in Libya as 143 tons of Libyan gold and billions in currency went missing.

I suggest that this is not unique to the Obama administration, it is pervasive in our government – the Clinton and Bush administrations did it, etc. The fact that Trump wants to investigate it doesn't necessarily absolve him of it, but... As US citizens with our tax dollars invested in this we should be starkly curious about these things and at least critical of anyone who tries to prevent us from investigating the disappearance of our money.

Use Common Sense During the Holiday's

Home fires increase during this time of year. Heating devices, fireplaces, holiday lighting, candles and decorations, all contribute to the increased risk.

North Branford Fire department Recommends:

- 1. Use only UL listed lights and extension cords.
- 2. Keep extension cord use to a minimum. Do not overload your electrical system. If you are blowing fuses, find out why. Check for frayed wires. If the lights don't work when you test them, toss them. Don't take the chance.
- 3. Keep decorations away from open flame and heating sources.
- 4. If you have a live tree, keep it watered and dispose of as soon it starts to dry out.
- 5. Keep your means of escape clear. Don't block a door with the tree or other decorations.
- 6. Use candles correctly. Keep away from any decorations, curtains and paper tablecloths.
- 7. Do not leave home without turning off all lights, extinguishing all candles and any portable heating units. At night check to make sure that your house is safe, before you go to bed.
- 8. Make sure you have at least one operating smoke detector on every floor.

Fireplace and Stove Safety:

More than one-third of Americans use fireplaces, wood stoves, and other fuel – fired appliances to heat their homes. Unfortunately, many people are unaware of the fire risks associated with wood and other fuels.

North Branford Fire Department encourages you to practice the following fire safety steps:

- 1. Have your chimney or wood stove cleaned and inspected annually
- 2. Keep the area around your fireplace or stove clear of flammable decorations or materials
- 3. Always use a metal mesh screen with fireplaces, and keep your glass doors open
- 4. Never use flammable liquids to start a fire
- 5. Use only seasoned hardwood
- 6. Build small fires that burn completely and produce less smoke
- 7. Never burn cardboard, trash or other debris in your fireplace or wood stove
- 8. *Never leave a fire unattended* and extinguish before going to bed or leaving the house
- 9. Soak hot ashes in water and place them in a metal container *outside and away* from your house




North Haven Camera Club Resumes Meetings


