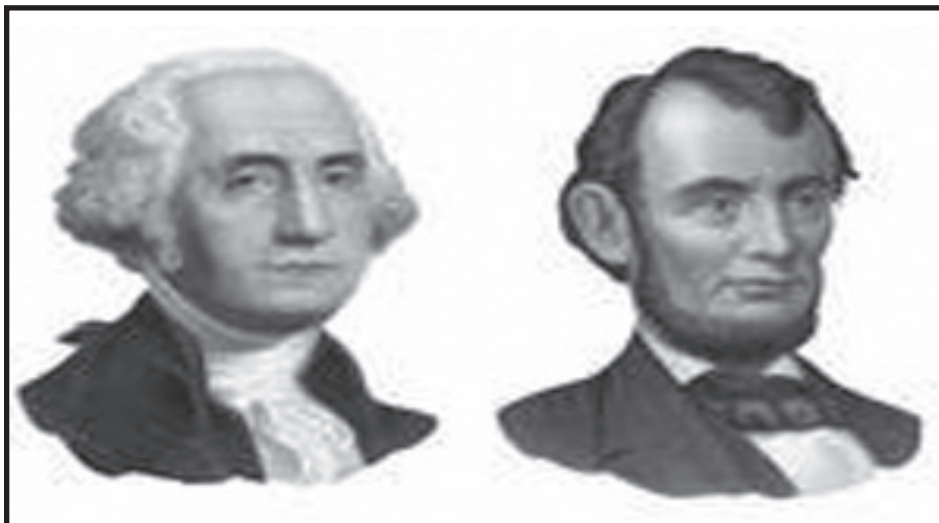

### Connecticut's Budget:

### Sunshine, Lollipops and Rainbows Everywhere?



If anyone had any question whether Governor Malloy is running for re-election, those doubts are eviscerated with rapid fire press releases that have transformed dolling out tax dollars for corporate welfare to distributing tax dollars to voters. Aside from believing that this blatant courting of voters is morally offensive, it is even more reckless

in light of the fiscal budget cliff we are facing 18 months from now. This political pandering is exactly what has gotten our country and state into such a mess, and the public must stand up against it because government collectively doesn't seem to have the will to do so.

As many of you may have read, Connecticut has a potential surplus of \$500 million for this budget year which ends on June 30. The surplus doesn't become official until the Comptroller certifies it in September, 2014. Despite this surplus, Connecticut still faces an approximately \$2 billion deficit in the next biennium, which is fiscal years 2015 and 2016. How can we be seeing increased tax revenues this year and such a projected dire budget ahead? It's easy. In order to create this surplus, the Governor delayed \$400 million in debt service payments, shifted operational programs and municipal grants to bonding, increased the practice of paying employees out of borrowed money instead of operating revenue; and raided savings accounts to pay for on-going programs. Finally, remember our cash flow issues that I've spoken and written about? The Governor borrowed \$750 million to put into our checkbook to solve that problem. All of this borrowing is the classic kicking of the can down the road.

As if these gimmicks were not offense enough, he's now taking this self-created surplus and proposing concepts that will only get us deeper into the hole. After offending teachers by stating that they only needed to "show up for four years" in order to get tenure and after tossing our education system into a sea uncertainty and offering the anchor of common core, a broken paddle for teacher evaluations and a leaking raft of new student testing, the Governor is attempting to win back our teachers with a proposal to not tax the income on teacher pensions. Frankly, Connecticut should not be taxing ANY retirement pensions (there are only a few states who do). Putting that aside, this proposal will cost \$25 million per year, and we have no way to pay for it a year from now unless taxes are increased.

Governor Malloy's actions remind me of a school yard bully. He's pushed around residents of Connecticut, stole our lunch money, and now that he's been caught by the teacher, he's cowering in fear and desperate to regain control of his subjects. Connecticut cannot afford this behavior, and as you can tell from my writing, I am deeply offended by this type of bullying.

## PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

According to recent research conducted by The Hartford, it seems like most baby boomers would rather go to the dentist for a root canal than talk to their aging parents about estate planning. The research indicated nearly 3 out of 4 parents of baby boomers were comfortable discussing estate planning with their kids, whereas only 54% of their children were comfortable having such discussions. It turns out that parents are more comfortable discussing estate planning than their baby-boomer children. *Who knew?* This "communication gap" can have serious consequences for your parents and family.

Talking about your parents dying is not a fun topic to explore— except for a few of you "sickos" out there. Although it may be a hard conversation to have, it can make a big difference after your parents are gone. This conversation is too important to neglect.

Getting the conversation started is usually the hardest part. A few simple guidelines can help turn this discussion into a positive experience. The most important rule (in my experience) is to include ALL of your siblings in the conversation. Nothing works quicker to undermine your intentions than excluding someone. Group discussion fosters a free exchange of ideas. Choose a comfortable and private setting for this family meeting that is free from distractions.

So now that you've got the family assembled in a comfortable, private space, what's next? How do you actually start the conversation? A good way to begin is to talk about your own plan. Tell your parents what your estate planning experience was like. Talk about what your estate plan contemplates. Another way to start the conversation is with an article (like this one) or book on estate planning. If your parents are readers this is a terrific place to start.

Assuming that you have created an opportunity to talk to your parents about their "exit plan" you should discuss several different aspects. Remain focused on the fact that you are trying to help your parents maintain independence and control over assets that took a lifetime to accumulate. Specifically discuss long term care. Have they considered what would happen if one or both of them had to spend time in a nursing home? Nursing home costs can quickly eliminate your parents' life savings. Ask about what type of estate plan they have in place. Make sure the plan fits their estate. Explore whether their estate plan contemplates tax issues, probate costs, or beneficiaries with disabilities. Don't neglect to focus on lifetime planning either. Make sure your parents have updated Powers of Attorney and Living Wills.

Remember, most parents want to discuss their estate plan with their adult children. Finding out that your parents have planned their estate will be very comforting. Finding out your parents have not made a plan is a great opportunity to help them get their affairs in order.

## Do Research on Selecting Preschool

Some people spend more time researching what kind of car to buy than what kind of preschool to send their children to. Why? Because they may not know that all programs are not equal and don't know what to look for or what questions to ask, especially if it's for your first child. I can help you with that! I talked to some of the preschool teachers in town and asked them for advice on selecting the right preschool for your child.

First there are differences in length of day; full time or part time. The FRC preschool in Northford is full time 9-3 five days a week, perfect for parents that work full time. Northford Preschool Academy and Nursery on Notch Hill are both part time programs; 2 or 3 days a week for half a day.

Once you figure out what kind of program fits your schedule, next you should make an appointment to visit or attend an open day. Make the most of your visit by getting a feel of the place and asking some important questions.

Teachers at the schools mentioned above all agreed that you should ask about their curriculum. Are they helping students get ready for kindergarten? Jaime DeFelice owner/teacher at Northford Preschool Academy suggests that parents also ask "How are lessons planned to meet the students' needs and interests?" Donna Hart, director/teacher at Nursery on Notch Hill also said "You should make sure there is enough time for free play and that they have structured circle times every day."

What about class size and ratio? How experienced and qualified are the teachers? Ask what the staff turnover is like, it's a good sign when the teachers have been there a long time; avoid places that change staff frequently. Ann-Marie McCarthy, supervisor of North Branford FRC also pointed out that parents should make sure preschool staff has current CPR, first aid and Epi-pen training.

All schools should have policies for things like security, discipline and sickness. Ask if you can see them or get a copy. Ann-Marie McCarthy suggests you ask how preschools communicate with families, is their parental involvement?

When you visit a school there is a lot of things to look out for, Doreen Stacy, head teacher at the FRC Preschool suggests that you pay attention to "how teachers interact with the children? How is the atmosphere?" Ann-Marie McCarthy adds that parents should make sure classrooms are neat and organized. Are there examples of student art work displayed? Do they have a memo board where they post things like the daily schedule, reminders for parents etc? How is the outdoor space?

Debbie Verrillo the children's librarian at Edward Smith Library found a great quote about the importance of preschool from Diane W. Frankenstein, Educational Consultant in children's and adolescent literature; "There are tremendous benefits for children who attend high quality preschool programs; "they learn better, behave better, live healthier and earn more for the rest of their lives." These findings come from the 1962-67 Perry Preschool Project study that followed children in the programs through the decades and into their 40's.

## North Branford Elderly & Totally Disabled Tax Relief Programs

Applications for the HOMEOWNER Elderly and/or Totally Disabled Programs are available in the Assessors Office now through May 15, 2014. Please apply Monday through Friday between 1-4 pm. Applicants must be 65 by December 31, 2013 to qualify. If totally disabled, there is no age requirement. Income levels are as follows: State Program: \$34,100 for a single person; \$41,600 for a married couple. Local Program: \$42,500 if single; \$52,500 if married.

Please be sure to bring your Federal Tax Return, if you file one, and your Social Security Statement (1099). If you do not file a return, you must provide proof of all forms of income, including your 1099 statement.

### ADDITIONAL VETERAN PROGRAMS:

The qualifications are the same as the elderly programs; however if 100% disabled, the income maximum is \$18,000, for a single person, and \$21,000 for a married couple, excluding Social Security.
