A path for tax relief that deserves consideration



Do you feel like you're overtaxed? If so, you're not alone. And based on current numbers, it would be hard to argue otherwise.

By now, you've likely heard that Connecticut is sitting on a massive budget reserve that's approaching \$4 billion. Add to that a heap of federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds—as much as \$800 million that could be used for tax relief.

Bottom line, state government can afford to give citizens a bigger break than what's currently under consideration at the capitol.

There's talk about phasing in a \$600 state childcare tax credit—two years from now. Increasing the property tax exemption is on the table, but neither the governor nor legislative Democrats are willing to return it to the \$500 level taxpayers benefitted from years ago. They also rejected indexing that income tax bracket to inflation, which would offer some small relief.

What's frustrating about this conversation is that a path exists to provide Connecticut broader tax relief as residents cope with runaway inflation, whether it be changes to the sales and income taxes or even the tax on diesel at the pumps—relief that would spur the type of economic recovery to provide lasting budgetary stability.

Democrats at the capitol are sticking to a federal rule they say would restrict the use of ARPA funds for tax relief to just \$180 million. Instead, they're using that one-time federal money for other purposes, such as baking in salary increases and bigger line items for state agencies and nonprofit entities. That's right, they're creating a fiscal cliff.

I'm among Republicans who contend Connecticut should instead do what more than a dozen other states have successfully done: challenge that federal rule in court and use more of the ARPA dollars to provide tax relief. We've urged Governor Lamont and Attorney General Tong to pursue that path, though neither has responded.

With that in mind, my colleagues and I last week introduced an amendment that would have required the attorney general to take action. It failed on a party line vote.

It's an avenue that demands attention.

After all, with the legislature on the precipice voting on a multi-year state worker employment pact that includes generous bonuses, a lot of struggling Connecticut residents will be wondering just who their government is working for.

SEN. COHEN LEADS PASSAGE OF BILL REQUIRING MORE DETAILED NOTIFICATION OF HERBICIDE USE AROUND LAKES AND PONDS

HARTFORD – State Senator Christine Cohen (D-Guilford) used her position as Senate Chair of the Environment Committee to help pass a bill in the state Senate this evening that requires anyone applying pesticides or herbicides to a lake or pond to let every abutting property owner or tenant know personally of that application, and to specify when the chemicals will be applied, rather than simply post a general notice in a local newspaper with a range of possible application dates – as is current law.

Senate Bill 116, "AN ACT CONCERNING NOTIFICATION OF PESTICIDE APPLICATIONS NEAR LAKES AND PONDS," passed the Senate this evening on a bipartisan and unanimous 32-0 vote and now heads to the House of Representatives for consideration.

The bill prohibits blanket notices for pesticide applications near lakes and ponds, which fail to enable people to know exactly when pesticides and herbicides will actually be applied – and to require the party contracting with the pesticide applicator to receive notice of when such pesticides will be applied. Notices can be by telephone, mail or in-person, and include date of the application.

"This bill came out of situation in my district where we found that pesticide notifications were running in local papers with potential application dates that effectively lasted all summer long," **Sen. Cohen** said. «These blanket notifications are unfair and prevent planning and use of our waterways. This sent up a red flag to me that we really need to fine-tune our pesticide and herbicide application laws, and so this proposal was born.»

The Food Pantry of North Branford has been distributing free supplemental food to town residents since 2015. We are able to provide this service because of the very generous donations of individuals and organizations as well as grants received. 100% of all donations are used for pantry operations. We are staffed completely by volunteers. Because we are not a town agency, we do not receive any government or town funding.

WHERE: 1382 Middletown Ave., Northford (St. Andrews Church, white with a red door).The Pantry entrance is at the rear of the church.

WHO: Town residents may register in person. There is a short registration form for CT Foodshare. There are no financial qualifications.

WHEN: Registered guests may shop once weekly. Hours of operation: Wednesdays from 4-7 pm and Fridays from 10 am- 1pm

PROXY SHOPPER: Registered guests may have a person shop for them if they are unable to shop themselves. This “proxy shopper” may be a friend, family member or caregiver. A proxy shopper must sign in when they take food for someone else.

OTHER: At the current time, masks are still required. The Pantry is not handicapped accessible. Guests are asked to remain in their cars until it is their turn to enter the building. Please bring your own reusable bags and/or box. Our inventory varies weekly. We close promptly at 7pm on Wednesdays and 1 pm on Fridays. Guests arriving after 6:45 pm on Wednesdays and after 12:45 pm on Fridays receive a pre-bagged box of food.

An old cat carrier or other large plastic items do not go into the recycle bin. Not all plastic can be recycled. It needs to have the recycling number 1 through 7 on it. And, black plastic is not recyclable.

The North Branford Police Department has a prescription drop box located in the police department lobby. They take unwanted prescriptions including pet prescriptions in the green drop box.

Community Wide Living Rosary

In the midst of the unrest in the world and the current state of affairs in Ukraine, it is our hope that the Catholic Christian community will heed the call of our Blessed mother and pray the Rosary for peace and justice. “The Fatima Message is the Message for Today”

The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, appeared six times to 3 shepherd children near Fatima, Portugal between May 13th and October 13th, 1917 with a message from God for every man, woman, and child of our century. She promised that God would grant peace to the entire world and many souls would go to Heaven if her requests were listened to and obeyed. Among Her requests was the recitation of the daily rosary. The Rosary is like a sword or weapon the Mother of God can use to cut down heresy and the forces of evil. The Rosary is most powerful, and many times has saved the world from situations as bad as the one facing us today. Pope Pius IX said, “Give me an army saying the Rosary, and I will conquer the world.”

The Catholic Church has officially endorsed the Fatima Message “as worthy of belief” since 1930. Five successive popes have publicly indicated their approval and belief in the validity and critical importance of the Fatima apparitions. Several popes have visited Fatima on solemn pilgrimage and Pope John Paul II has gone at least once every decade of his pontificate. His Holiness has publicly credited Our Lady of Fatima for saving his life during an assassination attempt in 1981(which parenthetically, took place on the 64th anniversary of the first Fatima apparition). The following year, while in Fatima, the Pope stated that, “the message of Fatima is more relevant and more urgent” than when Our Lady first appeared.
