Town Committees Pick Candidates for November Election

Both the Republican and Democratic Town Committees were busy this week with Caucuses to pick the slates for the November election.

There were several surprises coming from the RTC Caucus. For Town Council, present Council members, Mayor Anthony Candelora, Joanne Wentworth, Donald Fucci and Ron Sienna were picked to run again. In what can be considered a surprise, the RTC decided not to bring back present long time Council members Rose Angeloni and Michael Doody, as they opted for Vincent Caprio and Al Rose to fill the slate. Caprio has served several terms as a Democrat and recently changed parties and Rose has served two seperate times, resigning both times in the middle of his term.

For Board of Education, the RTC chose to bring back present BOE member Dave McMahon and add newcomers Theresa Frandsen, Colby O'Rourke and Philip Dahleyer to run on the ticket. Present BOE Chairperson Marcey Onofrio was left off the ticket.

On the Democrat side, the DTC chose to re-enter present Councilors Andy Esposito and Joe Faughnan and they added to the ticket, Dan Armin, Eric Hodgson, Elisabeth Caplan and Melinda Fonda. Hodgson and Armin presently serve on the Economic Development Commission and Caplan is the former Democratic Town Committee Chairperson as well as a former member of the BOE.

For the BOE, the DTC will put Deb Prunier, Mary Villano and Karen Ablondi on the November ballot.



The Town Council met to discuss the Route 80 project. We have worked with the state DOT, the Fire Chief and members of Company #1. The construction will be going by the fire house and there was concern about public safety. Together a plan has been put in

place to move the ladder truck to Co. #2 and they will work in front of the driveway in two sections. The work should be completed in approximately two weeks.

Repaving has also started on Route #80 near the East Haven line. Hopefully, this will be completed quickly.

The STW project is moving along and we are hoping to move into the building by October. The senior center and Park Rec will be under one roof.

The EDC has met and is working with Yale to present a plan for the town to best utilize the property by the old Wall Field.

We have many projects going on and it is important that your voices are heard. Soon there will be public hearings and also a Charette Study. This is a feasibility study applying the principles of smart planning involving the public. I look forward to this process and hearing the ideas and vision for the future use of all this property in the center of our town.

State Representative Vincent Candelora Connecticut's Gross Receipts Tax



As we dive into the depths of summer, the topic of rising gas prices come to the surface just in time for summer travel. Residents are starting to ask a lot of questions about the hidden state tax on gasoline that just increased on July 1st.

Connecticut's gross receipts tax is in addition to the 25 cent state and 18.4 cent federal excise taxes on

gasoline. This tax is a percentage of the wholesale price of gasoline and increased from 7% to 8.1% on July 1st (a 16% increase). In 2007, the tax increased from 6.3% to 7% on July 1, 2007. These automatic prescheduled increases can be harsh because they go into effect without any contemplation for the state of the economy or cost of gasoline at the time of the increase.

According to the Connecticut Energy Marketers Association (CEMA), the average wholesale price of gasoline in Connecticut is currently \$2.82/gallon and Connecticut state taxes on a gallon of gasoline total 45 cents. At the same time, Connecticut's Diesel Fuel Tax, which is based on the petroleum gross receipts tax rate, is scheduled to increase by 3.5 cents per gallon, which will increase trucking and transportation costs, causing a ripple effect that will increase consumer costs on everything from groceries and clothing, to construction, as well as other goods and services. Connecticut has the highest energy cost in the country and these type of taxes only contribute to the problem. In the long run, I believe Connecticut looses more revenue from the gross receipt tax increases by stifling the economy than it earns.

Republicans offered proposals this legislative session in committee and in both the State Senate and State House of Representatives to eliminate the tax hike and they proposed several options to replace the lost revenue. Unfortunately, those proposals did not get majority support to pass. Connecticut must make the reduction of this tax a priority to help give us a better economic competitive edge with other states and provide relief to its drivers.

The recent spell of hot, humid weather brought memories of my youth, the days before air conditioning. Whether global warming started a lot sooner or if things were just as miserable then I know what we are experiencing now is nothing new to me.

What is different is the way in which we sought relief. This brings the need to tell a little of North Haven's history. Did you know that the brick industry started in North Haven around 1800 and was active until probably 50 years ago when the clay from which the bricks were made, that bordered the Quinnipiac River ran out? The area from which the clay was dug was called "clay pits". As each pit was discarded it filled with fresh water providing the residents an ideal swimming and to many of us bathing facilities.

The kids, not working on the family farm spent a good part of their every day at Bare A Beach as it was called. Those of us working on the farm looked forward to 5 o'clock or so when our day's work was done and I, in particular, since I had to wait for my brother George to come home from work so he could take me and anyone else around to the claypit on Sackett Point Road in our, old excuse for a "pickup", where with a bar of soap in hand and a towel, presented a refreshing bath and relief from the heat.

Now these clay pits were very deep and several hundred feet wide with what could hardly be called a beach, so caution was needed that beginners were watched over by the older youth. A heavy wooden plank, firmly established, served as a diving board. Men and kids from all over, which wasn't really that many, since the population was a mere pittance to what it is today and for those living a considerable distance transportation of some sort was needed. To those having to walk it didn't make much sense since by the time you walked home you were all sweated up again.

Number 8 school, where I spent my first 7 grades was probably a quarter mile from the "clay pit" and we boys, no girls were allowed at Bare A Beach, couldn't wait for the first warm day in April when with our lunch bag in hand and eating as we ran, crossed State Street, and across Tenedines Cider Mill property to the railroad tracks, down the tracks to Sackett Point Road and through the high grass that screened the pit from "passers by". Even partially undressing as we ran so as to be the first to swim that season. Swimming is a misnomer since the ice cold water assured only a quick dip before we headed back before the hour was up.

I have to explain my just using the A in Bare A Beach. The word represented by the A was used only for an animal in our household. My parents would frown on even using the word "Damn" and that only by someone other than a family member. Even "Darn" wasn't really accepted so I still find it difficult, despite it's common use today to feel comfortable using it.. Our rear end was our "Behind" not our "A'.

Ole and Leana were driving home from celebrating their 50th Anniversary when they were stopped for going too fast. The officer said, "Do you know you were going 50MPH in a 30 MPH zone? Ole said, "No, I wasn't". What went on was they were arguing back and forth until Leana couldn't take it anymore and said to the officer, "Officer it's a waste of time trying to argue with Ole when he's been drinking". **Alton Eliason**



Child Safety Seat Tips

Remember the days when transporting our children in the family car was a chance for them to sit on our lap to see what the world was like from the front seat? Who can forget piling as many kids into the back of a station wagon as you can going to the cub scout meeting. While we can vividly recall these instances as "what all kids did" because heck, we did it when we were kids, little did we realize how dangerous these acts were. The leading cause of death in children under 16 years old is of injuries sustained in motor vehicle accidents. The government, state and federal, has recognized this and an implemented standard for vehicle manufactures and law makers as well to ensure that our children are safe when traveling the nation's roads.

Education and technology have come a long way. Better vehicle designs and passive safety devices (airbags) have helped immensely; however, the burden is still on the parent or care giver.

Walk into any Toy R Us and you will find a variety of child safety seat choices ranging in price from about \$16.00 to well over \$250.00. The "BEST" child safety seat you can buy is the seat that best fits your child and your specific vehicle. Listed below are some guidelines in regard to CSS and the motor vehicle laws that govern them.

Connecticut Motor Vehicle Laws

14-100a(c1)* Failure to secure/cause to be secured in a seatbelt any passenger 7 years of age or older and under 16 years of age.

14-100a(d) Transporting a child under 6 years of age OR weighing less than 60lbs without a CHILD RESTRAINT SYSTEM.

14-100a(d)(2) Failure to require a child Iyear and weighing less than 20lbs to ride in a CRS that is rear facing.

14-100a(d)(4) Securing a child in a booster seat without a safety belt that includes a shoulder belt.

Basic Child Safety Seat Guidelines

- 1) Newborn to 20lbs **AND** 1 year of age = Rear facing CRS
- 2) 20lbs to 40lbs = Forward facing CRS
- 3) 40lbs to 60lbs = Booster seat




