



### State Representative Vincent Candelora You Can't Walk Without Friction



Last week Frank Mentone, the publisher of this community paper, had me on his public access television show. He made a great statement during a discussion we were having, "You can't walk without friction." Not only is he scientifically correct, it's a perfect reminder for how government should operate. The legislative session had a lot of friction this

year, but without it, some things would not have been accomplished.

A new Speaker of the House was elected in January, Brendan Sharkey of Hamden. While the Speaker comes from the party in power (in this case, the Democrats), he or she is elected by the entire membership in the House and presides over the entire body. The speaker is the judge and jury of House operations.

As you can gather from my past articles, I have not supported some of the proposals this year, including the budget, and I'm openly critical of these policies. What doesn't come through in my writing; however, is the dramatic change in the way the House has operated this session under this new leadership.

I've always believed that a two party system works well when both sides listen to each others' arguments, openly debate the policies through public hearings and accept or reject changes after discussions. The more friction in the process, the better the product. In the end, one party or person doesn't have to support the proposal, but if the other side listens to the arguments and incorporates the suggestions, it likely will become a better product.

When I first got elected to the Connecticut House, almost no amendments were accepted from the opposing party and very few bills ever got tabled. Today, under this new Speaker, that process has changed. Debates on the floor are more meaningful and members listen a little better to the discussion because the debate now impacts the process. If you make a good argument, the bill may get tabled or changed with an amendment. In fact, numerous amendments offered by Republicans this year received acceptance and passage from the Democrats and bills were tabled from discussion if Republicans made compelling arguments on the floor. For instance, a bill to reduce the drug free zones in schools from 1200 feet to 300 feet had support by a majority of Democrats. After a couple of hours of discussion on the negative impacts of this proposal, the Democrats actually tabled the bill despite the initial support. Instances such as this were rare in the past, but seem to become more common now.

Some of your hard core partisan representatives view this give and take as weakness. However, when you observe the partisan fighting and intellectual intolerance in Washington DC, it is hard to believe that anyone would advocate for that process in Connecticut. Hartford certainly isn't perfect and I have not supported every bill. But having friction, rather than fighting, has helped for some better legislation for Connecticut residents and I tip my hat to Speaker Sharkey for fostering this environment.

### PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE By Attorney Marc P. Guertin

According to recent research conducted by The Hartford Insurance Group, it seems like most baby boomers would rather go to the dentist for a root canal than talk to their aging parents about estate planning. The research indicated about 71% of parents of baby boomers were comfortable discussing estate planning with their children, whereas only 54% of their children were comfortable having such discussions. It turns out that parents are more comfortable discussing estate planning than are their baby-boomer children-who knew? This "communication gap" can have serious consequences for your parents and family.

Talking about your parents dying is not a fun topic to explore. Although it may be a hard conversation to have, it can make such a difference after your parents are gone. This is too important of a conversation not to have.

Getting the conversation started is the hardest part. A few simple guidelines can help turn this conversation into a positive experience. The most important rule (in my experience) is to include ALL of your siblings in the conversation. Nothing works quicker to undermine your intentions than excluding someone. Group discussion fosters a free exchange of ideas. Choose a comfortable and private setting for this family meeting that is free from distractions.

The family is assembled, in a comfortable, private, space...then what? How do you actually start the conversation? A good way to start is to discuss your own plan. Discuss with your parents what your estate planning experience was like. Talk about what your estate plan contemplates. Another way to start the conversation is with an article or book on estate planning. If your parents are readers this is a terrific place to start.

Assuming that you have created an opportunity to talk to your parents about their "exit plan" you should discuss several different aspects. Remain focused on the fact that you are trying to help your parents maintain independence and control over assets that took a lifetime to accumulate. Focus on long term care: have they considered what would happen if one or both of them had to spend time in a nursing home? Nursing home costs can quickly eliminate your parent's life savings. Ask about what type of estate plan they have in place. Make sure the plan fits their estate. Explore whether their estate plan contemplates tax issues, probate costs, or beneficiaries with disabilities? Don't neglect to focus on lifetime planning. Make sure your parents have updated Powers of Attorney and Living Wills.

Remember, most parents want to discuss their estate plan with their adult children. Finding out that your parents have planned their estate will be very comforting. Finding out your parents have not made a plan is a great opportunity to help them get their affairs in order.

The recent efforts of the KKK to establish a chapter here brought back memories from, my childhood. It was a late summer night when my brother, Harold, shouted, "They're burning the cross again". This brought my mother and father with me following out into the dark of night to look over to the Bethany Ridge where sure enough a big cross was burning. We lived on Ridge Road in North Haven with probably the only clear view all the way over to Bethany. Such a sight would be impossible today with all the lights blazing, but then there weren't even street lights so the nights were truly dark.

It was an eerie sight and when they told me there were men in sheets with holes cut in them so they could see, burning the cross it added to the scariness I was experiencing. Apparently, this had been a common sight to the rest of the family, but was the first and lasting my lifetime that I saw it burning.and never dreamed I would experience another encounter.

My childhood buddy, Stanley Larson, and I spent most of our free time together dreaming and planning adventures to engage in. When Stanley mentioned going on an overnight camping trip I was all for it. Since-he had been to just the right spot where there was a little brook and a clearing where we could have a camp fire and far enough away from civilization to bring thoughts of venturing into the wild.

The date was set and Stanley's brother-in-law agreed to take us on the path leading to our destination. Late afternoon on the day agreed they arrived with a frying pan, hamburg, eggs, bacon, marshmallows and a small mattress rolled and tied. I never dreamed we would be experiencing the pleasure of civilization, but since sleeping bags were outside our realm of thought sleeping on the ground with a small blanket I thought more appropriate. But Stanley wasn't ready to discard all the pleasures of civilization.

Walter let us off on Shepherd Avenue, in Hamden at the trail leading to our venture. Remember this was while not totally devoid of humans, far from populated.

We took turns carrying the mattress up the winding trail until we came to a level spot cleared of trees and bushes with a crystal-clear brook running through it. A campfire was our first endeavor for our climbing efforts had kindled an appetite needing our first attention. With a campfire soon burning vigorously we made short rift of the hamburg. With dark fast ap-

proaching we decided to explore the area more thoroughly and was surprised to stumble over a felled tree showing charred marks. Exploring further we found the cross piece tied to the tree, it too was charred. Stanley didn't know anything about the KKK, but I did and the thoughts of the people in sheets coming to burn the cross took all fun out of our venture. After all it still wasn't dark so they still could be coming.

Stan didn't have any concern about men in sheets so we returned to our campfire and with sticks cut and carved to a point with our, always in pocket, pocket knives we started roasting our marshmallows. Sitting with our feet close to the fire it wasn't long before my shoes felt hot and on reaching down to feel the sole, I experienced pain such as I never had before. Withdrawing my hand my fingers were coated with melted rubber. Rubbing it off was impossible and already hugh blisters had formed. In seeking something to relieve the pain I put my hand in the brook where I kept it all night as I tried to sleep. With all the pleasure gone I couldn't wait for my mom and Walter to take us home.

Rubber soles weren't beyond shoe manufacturers material to save money during the depression and on coming home one rainy day with my new Tom McAnn shoes the wettness I felt was from the paper soles getting waterlogged. Tom McAnn were the most popular shoes in those days Alton Eliason.


